My dear people,

"I am shocked to learn of the harrowing plight facing millions of people in a number of countries in East Africa", Archbishop Denis Hart, President of the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference, said recently. "Sadly, there has been little coverage in Australia of this emerging tragedy. I am lending my voice and that of the Catholic Church in Australia to urge you to help if possible. Prolonged drought is causing widespread hunger across East African countries. Somalia, South Sudan and parts of Ethiopia and Kenya are the worst affected. The United Nations estimates that 23 million people are now on the brink of famine in South Sudan and other areas of East Africa and Yemen where 1.4 million children could die, in what could be the worst famine in decades. In South Sudan alone, 40% of the population is in urgent need

of food, with more than 270,00 children now severely malnourished and 100,000 people facing starvation." Pope Francis has made a worldwide call for assistance to these people. Bishop Ingham has added his voice, asking that the Diocese conduct an appeal throughout July.

An article in THE SYDNEY MORNING HERALD during the week reported that only one third of Australians seemed aware of the crisis. An audit of the public's perception and attitudes towards the disaster showed disappointing negativity. It seems many fallacies exist:

- Over population is the cause of famine. This is quite wrong. The reasons are civil war, drought, and economic collapse. "Send them a box of condoms instead of food. They only know how to breed nonstop and then beg for food" one comment was made on social media. Sadly, it attracted many likes.
- Domestic issues are more important than providing aid to other countries. This is hardly a Christian response or even a human response. Despite overseeing massive cuts (sadly) to the foreign aid program, the Turnbull Government has pledged \$68 million towards the crisis.
- * The money never gets to those who need it. In the reign of Pope John Paul the Catholic Church developed its own aid process—CARITAS INTERNATIONAL. There is a branch of CARITAS in every country in which the Church is present, so aid can be quickly directed from one Church agency to another without going through other agencies. CARITAS is directed by the Bishops in each Country.
- People affected by famine deserve it. This hardly warrants a response.
- Islam is to blame for the crisis. This is one of the most pernicious fallacies. In point of fact, three of the four most affected counties—South Sudan, Ethiopia and Kenya—are Christian majority countries. (Ethiopia has had the Faith since the time of Apostles.) Yemen is the only predominantly Muslim nation among those hardest hit.

United Nations efforts to raise at least \$4.4 billion in humanitarian aid from wealthy nations have fallen embarrassingly short as the world has remained preoccupied with Donald Trump, terrorism, political instability, Middle East turmoil and North Korea. This crisis may well be worse than the famine in Ethiopia in the 1980's.
