My dear people,

It is amazing what people can do, and will do, when they are motivated by love. We see this especially in the case of a mother. A mother will do anything, brave anything, suffer anything, endure anything, for the sake of her child. A Prison Governor once said that in his many years of his service he had not met five prisoners who had not had a good relationship with their mothers. The mothers had never failed to visit their sons and had never failed to take responsibility. "We see them everyday" he said, "mothers with maybe more than one drug addict in the family, queuing to visit the son in jail, living out their lives with no resources, no support, nothing. It is unbelievable, considering the amount of pressure that mothers come under and the amount of torture they have to go through because their children get into trouble and into crime". 
Once, during a severe winter in the Arctic, all but two people in a particular camp died of starvation. The two survivors were an Eskimo woman and her baby. The woman began a desperate search for food.

Eventually she found a small fish-hook. It was a simple matter to rig a line, but she had no bait, and no hope of getting bait. Without a moment's hesitation she took a knife and cut a piece of flesh from her thigh. Using this as bait she caught a fish. She fed her child and herself, saving the fish gut for bait. She lived on fish until spring when she walked out of the camp and found some other people.

It was no coincidence that the only adult to survive in that camp was a mother. What kept the mother alive was her concern for her child. There seems no limit to what a mother will go through for the sake of her child. A mother doesn't give up easily.

There is a wonderful example of this in today's Gospel. There we see the unshakeable determination of a mother. She just refused to be put off. How delighted she must have been when Jesus finally answered her prayer. All her trouble, all her begging, all her embarrassment, had not been in vain. She is a great example of faith. "Woman, you have great faith", Jesus told her.

The woman is a model of what we might call tough faith. Sometimes you hear people say. "It's easy for you, you've got great faith". But it's not like that at all. Faith does not always make things easy. In fact, the opposite is more likely the case. It's because we have faith that we refuse to give up. Faith impels us to



persevere, to struggle on, without any physical guarantees. Faith is not a magic wand. It demands humility, courage, perseverance and, above all, love. A mother never gives up. Neither does a person with faith. Faith and love are inseparable. Love is the expression of faith.
