ELEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME – YEAR B 17 June 2018

READINGS: Ezekiel 17:22-24; 2 Corinthians 5:6-10; Mark 4:26-34

The prophet Ezekiel foretold that God would take a twig and plant it on Mount Zion. There, under God's protective power, it would grow into a great cedar. Ezekiel was dreaming of the day when God would transplant Israel's exiles back home. He glimpsed the coming of a descendant of King David who would establish a universal kingdom.

The prophecy is fulfilled in Jesus. He tells the parables of the seed that grows by itself and the

mustard seed to encourage the early Church, which was worried by the slow growth of the Kingdom. The disciples must be patient and not expect instant results.

My dear people,

On the Feast of St Joseph this year Pope Francis published a new letter to the Church, REJOICE AND BE GLAD, "on the call to holiness in today's world". We should know the basic points he is trying to make, so over the next five weeks I shall try to summarise the five chapters.

Jesus wants us to be saints and not to settle for a mediocre existence. The Letter to the Hebrews encourages us to "run with perseverance the race that is set before us", and he reminds us that at all times we are surrounded by "a great cloud of witnesses"- the Saints. We all need examples to follow. Those examples are not only the Saints of the past. We can see holiness in those parents who raise their children with immense love, in those men and women who work hard to support their families, in the sick, in elderly religious who never lose their smile. Our next-door neighbours may be saints. Such people are actually making history without knowing it. We will find out on the Last Day. And let us not forget that sanctity does not belong just to the Catholic Church. Pope John Paul once stated that the world's modern martyrs speak more powerfully than the causes of division which produced them.

The Second Vatican Council reminded us that God's call to holiness for each of us is personal, "each in his or her own way". We are not meant to copy someone else's holiness. We must spend our lives trying to discern what God is asking of me, how to use to the full the gifts that He has given only to me. To be holy does not require being a bishop, a priest, or a religious. It is a mistake to think that holiness is only for those who can withdraw from ordinary affairs to spend much time in prayer. We are all called to be holy wherever we find ourselves. "Are you called to the consecrated life? Be holy by living out your commitment with joy. Are you married? Be holy by loving and caring for your husband or wife, as Christ does for the Church. Do you work for a living? Be holy by labouring with integrity and skill in the service of your brothers and sisters. Are you a parent or grandparent? Be holy by patiently teaching your little ones to follow Jesus. Are you in a position of authority? Be holy by working for the common good and renouncing personal gain."

The Pope stresses the "genius of woman" seen in feminine styles of holiness. In times when women tended to be ignored or overlooked, the Holy Spirit has raised up saints whose attractiveness produced new spiritual vigour and important reforms in the Church. We have only to think of Hildegard of Bingen, Bridget of Sweden, Catherine of Siena, Teresa of Avila, and Therese of Lisieux.

Holiness grows through small gestures - refusing to gossip, listening to children even when we are tired, a little time in prayer when we are feeling anxious, a kind word or gesture to a poor person, finding more perfect ways of doing what we are already doing. In the Church we find everything we need to grow towards holiness - the gifts of Scripture, the Sacraments, holy places, living communities, the witness of the Saints and, especially, the beauty of God's love.

Each of us lives in a specific moment of history. We are called to sanctify this moment, and we do this by reproducing Christ's life, constantly dying and rising anew with Him. We must allow Christ to love the world in and through us. "There is only Christ" said St Paul. We reproduce His poverty, His closeness to the outcast, and other ways to He showed His self-sacrificing love.

Christ came to establish His kingdom. Our mission in life is to build with Him that kingdom of love, justice, and universal peace. Our mission is a dual one - we must be both contemplatives and activists. Building the kingdom does not mean ignoring the need for moments of quiet before God. People who are slaves to the endless array of consumer goods risk losing the meaning of their lives. But, at the same time, we do not use prayer as an escape from actively engaging in our mission to the world. Activity without prayer can simply be social work, whereas God is calling us to be evangelisers.

"Do not be afraid of holiness", says Pope Francis. "Do not be afraid to set your sights higher, to allow yourself to be loved and liberated by God. Do not be afraid to let yourself be guided by the Holy Spirit. Holiness does not make you less human. Holiness is an encounter between your weakness and the power of God's grace (my emphasis).

The modern philosopher/theologian, Leon Bloy, wrote that when all is said and done, "the only great tragedy in life is not to become a saint".
