

My dear people,

In the final chapter of his letter REJOICE AND BE GLAD, Pope Francis speaks of the Christian life as a constant battle - not a battle just against the world or even our human weaknesses, but a constant struggle against the devil, the prince of evil. We will not admit the existence of the devil if we insist on regarding life by empirical standards alone. Only the existence of the devil enables us to understand how evil can have such destructive force. He is present in the very first pages of the Scriptures, which end with God's victory over the devil. It would be a mistake to think of the devil only as a figure of speech. This would lead us to let down our guard. The devil does not need to possess us. He poisons us with the venom of hatred, envy, and vice. "Like a roaring lion, he prowls around, looking for someone to devour" (1 PETER 5:8).



Those who deny that holiness is a constant battle fall prey to failure or mediocrity. Our weapons are prayer, meditation on the Word of God, the celebration of Mass, Eucharistic adoration, the sacrament of Reconciliation, works of charity. If we become careless, the false promises of evil will easily seduce us.

How can we know if something comes from the Holy Spirit or the spirit of the world or the spirit of the devil? The only way is through discernment, which calls for something more than intelligence or common sense. It is a gift which we must implore. God will surely give us this gift if we confidently ask the Holy Spirit, and then seek to develop it through prayer, reflection, reading, and good

counselling. The gift of discernment has become all the more necessary today, since contemporary life offers immense possibilities for action and distraction, and the world presents all as good. All of us, especially the young, are immersed in a culture of zapping. Without the wisdom of discernment we can easily become prey to every passing trend.

Discernment is necessary not only at extraordinary times when we need to resolve grave problems and make crucial decisions - we need it at all times to help us recognise God's timetable, lest we fail to hear the promptings of His grace and disregard His invitation to grow. We must all strive for all that is great, better, and more beautiful. "For this reason," says Pope Francis, "I ask all Christians not to omit, in dialogue with the Lord, a sincere daily 'examination of conscience'."

God speaks to us in a variety of ways. We cannot do without the silence of prolonged prayer, which enables us better to perceive God's language. Nevertheless, it is possible that, even in prayer itself, we could refuse to let ourselves be confronted by the Holy Spirit who acts as He wills. Prayerful discernment is born of a readiness to listen - to the Lord and to others, and to reality itself, which always challenges us in new ways. Only if we are prepared to listen will we have the freedom to set aside our partial or insufficient ideas. God may be asking us to accept a call that can shatter our security, but lead us to a better life. It is not enough that everything be calm and peaceful. God may be offering us something more and we do not recognise it.

Naturally, this attitude of listening entails obedience to the Gospel as the ultimate standard, and the treasury of the Church's teaching. Discernment is a growing understanding of God's patience and His timetable, which are never our own. It entails a readiness to make sacrifices, even to sacrificing everything. The Holy Spirit liberates us - He expels the fear that makes us ban Him from certain parts of our lives. God asks everything of us, but he also gives everything to us. He does not want to enter our lives to cripple or diminish them, but to bring them to fulfilment.

The Holy Father concludes his letter by reflecting on Mary because she lived the Beatitudes as none other. "She is that woman who rejoiced in the presence of God, who treasured everything in her Heart, and who let

herself be pierced by a sword. She is the Saint among the Saints, blessed above all others. She teaches us the way of holiness and she walks ever at our side. She does not let us remain fallen, and at times she takes us into her arms without judging us."
