

My dear people,

During their annual conference in May, the Australian Bishops celebrated Mass at St Patrick's Church, Church Hill, in The Rocks area of Sydney (Grosvenor Street, towards the approach to the Sydney Harbour Bridge). The Mass commemorated 200 years since an extraordinary happening regarding the Eucharist. Fr Jeremiah O'Flynn arrived in Sydney in 1817 at a time when Catholicism was still outlawed. He had an appointment from Rome as Prefect Apostolic to the new colony, but failed to obtain government approval. He told Governor Macquarie that his official papers would arrive soon but, when they had not appeared after six months, he was arrested and deported on 20 May 1818. In the months he was in Sydney, he had been very zealous in his pastoral ministry, and had celebrated clandestine Masses in some Catholic homes.



Before his departure, Fr O'Flynn left a consecrated Host in a pyx in the home of a family called Davis. This became the focus for adoration of the Blessed Sacrament for two years. When the next priest arrived, the Host was found to be entirely incorrupt. The present St Patrick's was built over this spot and there, under the care of the Marist Fathers, the Blessed Sacrament is exposed every



day in the Monstrance. The interior of the church is typically French, the High Altar being made of beaten brass and shipped from France. Well worth a visit.

As you know, during Year B of the Church's Year, we read from the Gospel of St Mark. But it is the shortest of the Gospels, so we take a break for five weeks and from next Sunday we read from chapter six of St John's Gospel, the chapter where Jesus introduces His disciples to His teaching on the Eucharist. In his description of the Last Supper, St John describes the washing of the disciples' feet by Jesus, rather than the narrative of the consecration of the bread and wine, having covered this teaching of the Eucharist previously in chapter six.

It is a clever vehicle for a basic doctrine - our reception of Holy Communion is not an end in itself. The Eucharist leads to action. It is why the Celebrant at Mass ends with the words: "Ite, Missa est", wrongly translated as "Go, the Mass is ended", when the meaning is "Go, you are sent" - we are all missionaries to the world in which we live, work, and recreate. Interesting word "recreate" because it also means "re-create".

St John begins chapter six with the feeding of the 5,000 using just five barley loaves and two fish. Jesus speaks to the crowd of the true bread from heaven, Himself. "I am the bread of life". Almost

as an aside, St John writes "It was shortly before the Feast of Passover". This miracle points to the Last Supper, Christ's Passover which He will accomplish during Passover Week, His pass-over from death to life which we must accomplish in our life - to death - to life. The Eucharist is our food for this journey we all must take.
