READINGS: Isaiah 60:1-6; Ephesians 3:2-3,5-6; Matthew 2:1-12

The prophet Isaiah cheers the exiles returning from captivity in Babylon with a vision of Jerusalem restored and free.

The prophecy is fulfilled in Christ and the Church, the new Israel.

(FIRST READING)

In his Letter to the Ephesians, St Paul expresses the theological meaning of today's Feast — both Jew and Gentiles are invited to share in the salvation brought by Christ. **(SECOND READING)**

Three Gentiles come from a far country to pay homage to the Christ-child, while the Jewish leaders reject Him. **(GOSPEL)**

We must never take for granted the precious gift of our faith in Christ. As stewards of this gift we must do whatever is necessary to strengthen it and be eager to share it with others.

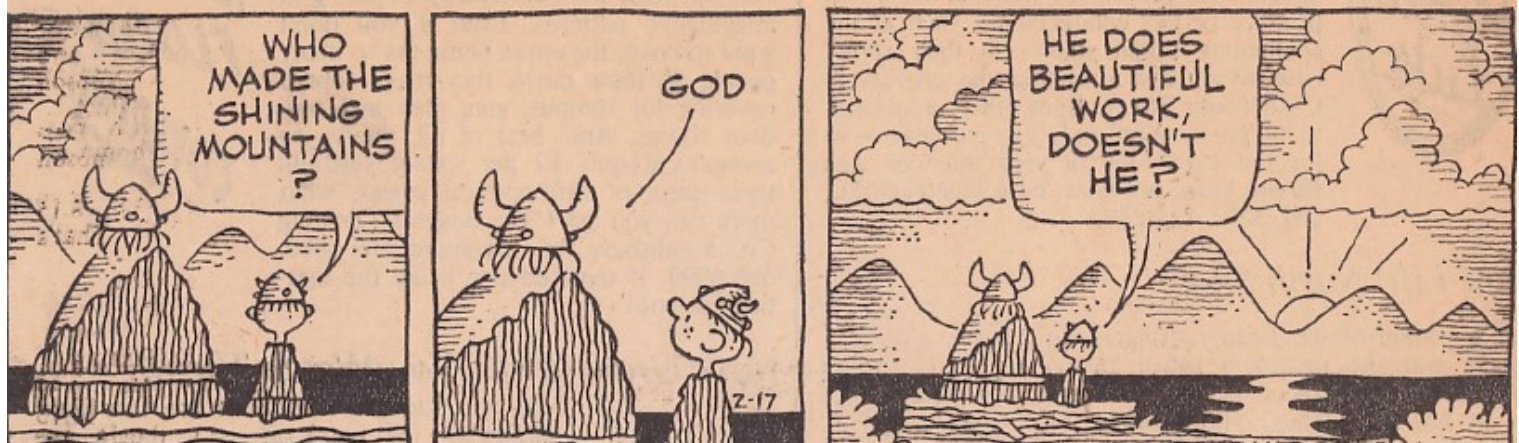

My dear people,

In the days before people had access to calendars, the dates of the important festivals were read out to the people on the Solemnity of the Epiphany, the Twelfth Day of Christmas. This ancient custom has been revived. The proclamation went like this (with local dates added): The glory of the Lord has shone upon us, and shall always be manifest among us, until Jesus comes again. Through the rhythms of times and seasons let us celebrate the mysteries of salvation.



Let us recall, firstly, the climax of the year, the Easter Triduum of the Lord: His Last Supper, His Crucifixion, His Burial and His Rising, celebrated between the evening of 18 April and the evening of 21 April.

Each Easter - as on each Sunday - Holy Church makes present the great and saving deed by which Christ has forever conquered sin and death: From Easter, as a centre point, are reckoned all the days we keep holy.

- Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent, will occur on 6 March.
- The Ascension of the Lord will be commemorated on 2 June.
- Pentecost, the joyful conclusion of the season of Easter, will be celebrated on 9 June.
- The feast of the Patron of our Church and Parish, the Immaculate Conception of Our Lady, will be celebrated on Monday 9 December.
- The First Sunday of Advent will occur on 1 December.

Likewise the pilgrim Church proclaims the Passover of Christ in the feasts of the holy Mother of God, in the feasts of the Apostles and Saints, and in the commemoration of the Faithful Departed.

To Jesus Christ, Who was, Who is, and Who is to come, Lord of time and history, be endless praise, for ever and ever. Amen.



As far as is possible, we will venerate the Sacred Heart of Jesus each First Friday of the month, and the Immaculate Heart of Mary each First Saturday. The sacred Liturgy is the most important thing we do in our lives as Jesus' followers. The Liturgy is both the source and the summit of our Christian lives. Everything we do in life is directed towards, and finds its fulfilment, in Christ's sacrifice on the Cross. Everything we do receives its power from Christ's sacrifice.

We are reading on these Sundays of Year C from St Luke's Gospel, often called the Gospel of Hospitality. Each Gospel writer sets his account of Jesus' life within a theme – Luke presents Jesus on a journey to Jerusalem to die. On the way

He pops into people's houses for a meal and uses it as an occasion to preach. In Luke's Gospel the "little" people are prominent: Elizabeth and Zachary, Mary and Joseph, Simeon and Anna, shepherds, prostitutes, the poor and the crippled, the good thief. Our parishes must be centres of hospitality where everyone feels included and wanted. This year try and make contact with a parishioner you have never spoken to before. Do you sit in the same seat at Mass? Perhaps sit somewhere else occasionally. Do you go to the same Mass each weekend? Go to a different Mass now and then and see who the other parishioners are. Support parish initiatives and functions. We are continually urging lapsed Catholics to return "home". We must make sure there is a "home" to come to.

Perhaps you have a friend who is a "lapsed" Catholic. Without being too "heavy", you might gently invite them to come back. Perhaps you have a non-Catholic friend who might just be waiting for that gentle suggestion to join us.

Pray for your priests. Pray for vocations.
