

My dear people,

Do you seek happiness? You might well think that is a stupid question. But, think again. 'Happiness' does not exist as a 'thing' any more than 'prayer' exists as a 'thing'. There is no such thing as prayer — there are only people who pray. There is no such thing as happiness — there are only people who are happy. Happiness is really a by-product of something else. St Luke uses the Greek word *makarios* (happy or blessed) — enduring happiness comes from one's standing before God. Like His Mother in her Magnificat, Jesus turns the social order of the world upside-down. Those truly blessed by God are those the world usually looks down on — the poor, the hungry, the dispossessed, the reviled because of creed or colour.

We are reading today St Luke's parallel to St Matthew's account of the Beatitudes (Blessings). St Matthew sees Jesus as the new Moses, and has Jesus preaching from a mountain. Matthew tends to spiritualise the concepts (the poor in spirit, those who hunger for righteousness — perhaps to include all of us who are not actually hungry or downtrodden). Luke is much more basic — he presents Jesus teaching, rather, down on the plain where the people actually live. Jesus is addressing those who really are hungry and thirsty, and who are marginalised. Why are they happy or blessed? Because they are free to acknowledge their reliance on God. The unfortunate, says Luke, are the corresponding rich, well-fed, laughing and 'respectable'. God cannot come into their lives because they have no room for Him. "There was no room at the inn" for the infant Christ — interesting that it is St Luke who says this (2:7). Obviously, we are meant to read much more into this. The Beatitudes of Jesus require us to change our way of thinking because they reverse the values by which many of us live. "How happy are you who are poor: yours is the kingdom of God" - that is, God is on your side.

Did this have any real meaning for the poor who were listening? Not really. The statement as such was not really going to help them. (Mind you, the fact that Jesus Himself was truly poor made the message 'real'). The 'crunch' is that we are reading a 'Gospel' — a proclamation and a making present of Jesus Himself, the Risen One.

Jesus' statement is an invitation to the listener (then and now) who wishes to be on the side of God. 'Happiness' will come to those who give rather than keep. Jesus is really saying "If you want to be on the side of God you had better be on the side of the poor." Read this way, if everyone who said they believed in God actually <u>did</u> something for the poor then, yes, the Kingdom of God has already come.

The famous Archbishop Hélder Câmara once said: "Saints may be found in slums, but we cannot retain slums in order to make them the breeding ground of Saints."
