

## ASCENSION OF OUR LORD — YEAR C

**2 JUNE 2019**

**READINGS:** Acts 1:1-11; Ephesians 1:17-23; Luke 24:46-53

In his GOSPEL, St Luke has shown that ‘the time of Israel’ has yielded to ‘the time of Christ’. Now ‘the time of Christ’ is to yield to ‘the time of the Church’. The Word of salvation will go forth from Jerusalem to the ends of the earth. Luke tells us about this in his second book, the Acts of the Apostles. The Ascension is seen as the culmination of Jesus’ earth life and the start of the Church’s mission.

My Dear People,

In today's First Reading St Luke gives us a poetic portrayal of Jesus' Ascension. Angels announce that He has gone to heaven and promise, but do not describe, His return. We might be quick to surmise that the return is Jesus' return in glory at the end of time. But the 'return' happens before this. His return would be ten days later at Pentecost when His Spirit would descend upon the apostles.

Christ would no longer be bodily present to the apostles. He would be spiritually present – a deeper presence than face to face. Jesus had to leave the earth bodily – for that restricted Him to one time and place. Now, risen from the dead and seated at the Father's right hand, He is present through the power of the Holy Spirit to all peoples of all times.



So then, the Ascension is not the end of the story at all – it is the beginning! Today's feast merely celebrates the end of Part One of Christ's life on earth – His physical presence – and the beginning of Part Two – His presence in the Sacraments and in His Body, the Church. If the world wishes to find Christ now, it must look to His Church. What an awesome responsibility is ours! Christ's credibility rises or falls on our witness! His Presence in the Sacraments is merely to strengthen His Presence in us. Christ's ascension into Heaven, then, was not to distance Himself from His Church but to be closer to it.

This Feast of the Ascension, and the commissioning of the Church, reminds us of the missionary nature of the Church. The Church cannot keep the joy of salvation to herself – that would be a contradiction in terms. Thank God for the faith and enthusiasm and commitment of missionaries. For two thousand years they have left family and home and country to tell the world that Christ is the answer to life, and that by following Him we become not only more holy but more human.

We can, of course, become missionaries ourselves, or we can support missionaries by prayer and financial support. The Propagation of the Faith Society was begun in the nineteenth century by a French lay woman who believed that by putting away a few pennies each day, ordinary working people could support the work of the missions. Her vision was so successful that the Propagation of the Faith Society is now a Pontifical Society – that is, under the direct jurisdiction of the Pope. Here in Australia, the appeal is conducted in every Church every year. A percentage of the monies collected is kept for our apostolate to the Aboriginal people. The remainder is allocated by the Holy Father as he sees fit. By agreement, this year, emphasis is going to be placed on the Church in Ghana in the ongoing protection and development of children who are vulnerable. The Marian Sisters of Eucharistic Love welcome children who are at risk of being harmed or killed by their family or community due to perceived abnormalities in their behaviour or appearance.



In the universal Church, today is World Communications Sunday, a day to reflect on our use of the media, and a day to pray for those involved in the media. The media, whether it be the written word or the world of sound and visual arts, plays an important role in our lives. Our lives, in many respects, are moulded by the media. We pray that those responsible will use the means at their disposal as a vehicle for the truth and for the uplifting of the human mind.



In the Southern Hemisphere, today begins the Week of Prayer For Christian Unity. Christ prayed at the Last Supper that all His followers would be one. A divided Church is a scandal to the non-Christian world. Christian unity should be one of the regular themes of our prayers.
