My Dear People,

I want to introduce you to a beautiful woman who recently passed away. THELMA INNES (née Rial) was born in 1922 at West Wyalong. When Thelma was seven, the family moved to the Wagga Wagga area where her father continued to work on farming properties.

Thelma had a happy childhood, and easily made friends. She began her schooling at St Mary's Primary School in Wagga, and went on to Secondary at Mount Erin Convent. With financial help from the nuns, Thelma pursued her love of music. She would spend many hours in the nuns' chapel, joining them in choir. At the age of 14, and with her family's blessing, Thelma told the nuns she wanted to become a Catholic. She never lost the Faith.



Between 1936 and 1939, Thelma completed her AMEB singing and piano exams with wonderful results. She began taking students while working at the local telephone exchange. In 1941, Thelma moved to Wollongong, and lived with her aunt who managed the Sorrento Guesthouse in Smith Street. She began to teach music at St Mary's College in Harbour Street.

During the war years, Thelma jointed the Illawarra Variety Entertainers where she became a "fascinating and delightful" pianist. She travelled to Sydney each week to continue studies at the Conservatorium of Music. There in 1947 she was awarded a Performers Diploma for singing from Trinity College of Music in London.

Thelma married Jack Innes in December 1946 at St Francis Xavier's Cathedral. She continued to teach at St Mary's until the birth of their first daughter, Jill, in 1954. (Jill would later marry Chris Dowdell, a brother of Father Bernie). In 1960, Thelma and Jack purchased a home in Church Street. It was to be the family home for 59 years.

In 1964, when Colleen, their second daughter, started school, Thelma began teaching choirs at our own St Pius X school. She continued for 14 years with outstanding eisteddfod success.

During the 1960s and '70s, Thelma was a pianist on the club scene. She spent many years at the Illawarra Master Builders Club accompanying guest artists. She also taught Scripture in the state schools for many years.

Jack died in 2000, and in 2005 Thelma suffered a heart attack. She would survive another 14 years.

Having developed macular degeneration, Thelma had to surrender her driver's licence, but continued to visit her friends, and nursing homes, by foot, bus and taxi. Deemed legally blind, she was given a white cane, but rarely used it for fear it might get dirty.

Thelma's final year was spent in our parish at Uniting Care in Waples Road.

Thelma died on Pentecost Sunday. May she rest in peace.
