Message from Fr Duane

A Pastoral Statement from our Bishop, Brian Mascord, regarding temporary Mass changes as a result of the increasing risk of coronavirus is attached. To summarise the practical changes that will take place at this time at all Masses:

- Communion of the Precious Blood will be for the celebrant only.
- Given that one of the easiest ways to transmit a virus is by the transmission of saliva, Communion will be received only in the hand.
- Clergy and parishioners are not to shake hands during the sign of peace, but should acknowledge each other at the exchange with the words "Peace be with you."
- All ministers of holy Communion (both ordinary and extraordinary) are to use hand sanitisers before the distribution of holy Communion commences, and are not to physically touch anyone in the act of blessing.
- Holy water fonts are to be emptied or removed.

While I am aware there are varied opinions on these matters, these directives from our Bishop will enable us to take a united approach in our Masses at this time. Let us not be tempted to panic at this time; rather let's keep in mind that we are taking these extra precautions at the advice of health professionals for the sake of the most vulnerable amongst us, including the elderly and the sick – for the sake of their physical health and their peace of mind. If anyone has any questions or concerns about these temporary changes, please feel free to raise them with me at any time.

SUNDAY 8 MARCH 2020 — SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT (YEAR A)

First Reading — Genesis 12:1-4 — *The call of Abraham, the father of God's people.*

The Lord said to Abram, 'Leave your country, your family and your father's house, for the land I will show you. I will make you a great nation; I will bless you and make your name so famous that it will be used as a blessing. 'I will bless those who bless you: I will curse those who slight you. Second Reading — 2 Timothy 1:8-10 — *God has saved us, and called us to be holy.*

With me, bear the hardships for the sake of the Good News, relying on the power of God who has saved us and called us to be holy – not because of anything we ourselves have done but for his own purpose and by his own grace. This grace had already been granted to us, in Christ Jesus, before the beginning of time, but it has only been revealed by the Appearing of our saviour Christ Jesus. He abolished death, and he has proclaimed life and immortality through the Good News.

Gospel Acclamation — Matthew 17:5

Glory and praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ! From the shining cloud the Father's voice is heard: this is my beloved Son, hear him. Glory and praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ!

Gospel — Matthew 17:1-9 — His face shone like the sun.

Jesus took with him Peter and James and his brother John and led them up a high mountain where they could be alone. There in their presence he was transfigured; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became as white as the light. Suddenly Moses and Elijah appeared to them; they were talking with him. Then Peter spoke to Jesus. 'Lord,' he said 'it is wonderful for us to be here; if you wish, I will make three tents here, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' He was still speaking when suddenly a bright cloud covered them with shadow, and from the cloud there came a voice which said, 'This is my Son, the Beloved; he enjoys my favour. Listen to him.' When they heard this, the disciples fell on their faces, overcome with fear. But Jesus came up and touched them. 'Stand up,' he said 'do not be afraid.' And when they raised their eyes they saw no one but only Jesus. As they came down from the mountain Jesus gave them this order. 'Tell no one about the vision until the Son of Man has risen from the dead.'
