

Message from Fr Duane

As you may have heard, the Covid restrictions have been significantly eased by the NSW government (starting Monday 7 December). The decision to move from the 4 square metre rule to the 2 square metre rule means we can potentially double the capacity of our churches starting next weekend! This has many implications:

**7pm Sunday Mass:** The extra 7pm Sunday Mass was an extra Mass that I decided to celebrate in order to accommodate all of those wishing to come to Sunday Mass. I wish to thank once again all of the parishioners who generously agreed to come to the 7pm Mass rather than their preferred Mass time. I am also aware that the 7pm Mass may actually have become a preferred Mass time for some, and to those people I apologise, but now that capacity limits won't require this extra Mass, I will be discontinuing the 7pm Mass after this weekend. The final 7pm Sunday Mass will be this Sunday, 6 December.

**Christmas Mass Registrations:** We are aware that two of the Christmas Mass options hit capacity during the week. As a result of the relaxing of restrictions from the NSW Government, we are now able to double our capacity for Christmas Masses. If your preferred Mass was "sold out" when you attempted to book, you can now choose that preferred Mass. However, please make sure to send a quick email to unanderra@dow.org.au to let us know you will not attend the original one.

**Pre-registration is still vital for Masses:** While it is unlikely that we reach our new capacity, at least for a while, pre-registration assists monitors greatly, reducing queuing times, and also enables us to digitise attendance lists more quickly (which is still required by the government for contact tracing purposes). The registration process will therefore continue as normal for all Masses, with the added guarantee that you will be able to attend your preferred Mass for the foreseeable future at least. *NB: All of the other Covid safety practices remain in place at this time.* 

**Sacrament of Reconciliation:** The most recent Diocesan Directives allow for a return to the normal practice of the Sacrament of Reconciliation. As such, you will no longer need to "book an appointment" for the Sacrament; you can simply attend any of the usual Reconciliation times at either Unanderra or West Wollongong. We will have disinfectant wipes in the confessionals for penitents to use to wipe down their touched areas after their confession (for Covid safety, not as a penance).

The standard times for this Sacrament are:

**St Therese West Wollongong:** 4.30pm-5.15pm Wednesday / 9.30am-10.30am Saturday **Immaculate Conception Unanderra:** 4.30pm-5.15pm Thursday (Fr Jerzy) / 5pm-5.30pm Saturday NB: The Sacrament is still available by appointment as well.

Congratulations to the 36 young people who received First Holy Communion last Sunday at Edmund Rice College Hall. They were all very prayerful and reverent in spite of the difficult conditions in the heat, and should be very proud of themselves! Thanks again to Judith Hurley from Edmund Rice College for all her support, to the Sacramental Team for their wonderful work throughout this second half of the year to make the Sacraments available for our young people and their families, and thanks to many other helpers across our two parishes and primary schools. Thanks also to Fr David O'Brien for celebrating Sunday morning's parish Masses again this week.

### SUNDAY 6 DECEMBER 2020 — SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT (YEAR B)

**First Reading** — Isaiah 40:1-5,9-11 — *Prepare the way for the Lord.* 

'Console my people, console them' says your God.

'Speak to the heart of Jerusalem and call to her that her time of service is ended, that her sin is atoned for, that she has received from the hand of the Lord double punishment for all her crimes.'

A voice cries, 'Prepare in the wilderness a way for the Lord.

Make a straight highway for our God across the desert.

Let every valley be filled in, every mountain and hill be laid low.

Let every cliff become a plain, and the ridges a valley; then the glory of the Lord shall be revealed and all mankind shall see it; for the mouth of the Lord has spoken.'

Go up on a high mountain, joyful messenger to Zion. Shout with a loud voice, joyful messenger to Jerusalem.

Shout without fear, say to the towns of Judah, 'Here is your God.'

Here is the Lord coming with power, his arm subduing all things to him.

The prize of his victory is with him, his trophies all go before him.

He is like a shepherd feeding his flock, gathering lambs in his arms, holding them against his breast and leading to their rest the mother ewes.

#### Responsorial Psalm — Lord, let us see your kindness, and grant us your salvation.

#### **Second Reading** – 2 Peter 3:8-14 – We wait for new heavens and a new earth.

There is one thing, my friends, that you must never forget: that with the Lord, 'a day' can mean a thousand years, and a thousand years is like a day. The Lord is not being slow to carry out his promises, as anybody else might be called slow; but he is being patient with you all, wanting nobody to be lost and everybody to be brought to change his ways. The Day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then with a roar the sky will vanish, the elements will catch fire and fall apart, the earth and all that it contains will be burnt up.

Since everything is coming to an end like this, you should be living holy and saintly lives while you wait and long for the Day of God to come, when the sky will dissolve in flames and the elements melt in the heat. What we are waiting for is what he promised: the new heavens and new earth, the place where righteousness will be at home. So then, my friends, while you are waiting, do your best to live lives without spot or stain so that he will find you at peace.

#### **Gospel Acclamation**

Alleluia, alleluia! Prepare the way for the Lord, make straight his paths: all people shall see the salvation of God. Alleluia!



#### **Gospel** — Mark 1:1-8 — *Make straight the paths of the Lord.*

The beginning of the Good News about Jesus Christ, the Son of God. It is written in the book of the prophet Isaiah: Look, I am going to send my messenger before you;

he will prepare your way. A voice cries in the wilderness: Prepare a way for the Lord, make his paths straight, and so it was that John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. All Judaea and all the people of Jerusalem made their way to him, and as they were baptised by him in the river Jordan they confessed their sins. John wore a garment of camel-skin, and he lived on locusts and wild honey. In the course of his preaching he said, 'Someone is following me, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to kneel down and undo the strap of his sandals. I have baptised you with water, but he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit.'
