Message from Fr Duane

This Sunday I thank God for the love of my own father, and of fathers throughout the nation, as we celebrate Fathers Day. Let us also pray for those for whom Fathers Day may bring some sadness, through grief, loss, or complicated relationships. May God bless all fathers and father figures among us, that they may model ever more perfectly the love of God, especially through the intercession of St Joseph, earthly father of Jesus.

This week also begins National Child Protection Week, an initiative of NAPCAN (the National Association for Prevention of Child Abuse and Neglect - more information to be found here <https://www.napcan.org.au/get-involved-2021/>) The Church in general and we as a parish community always support this cause, including learning humbly from past mistakes as a Church, and as a Church in Australia we will mark "Safeguarding Sunday" next Sunday 12th September.

Though not directly related, this week I noticed some sound advice from NSW Chief Psychiatrist Dr Murray Wright regarding caring for children and young people during the present pandemic, and it is fitting to reflect and act upon this for our children this week: "Some kids will act out and get irritable and angry, defiant. Some kids will withdraw. Some kids, particularly younger kids, might become clingy and really insecure. Parents should assume their kids are struggling with the pandemic, because we all are, and make it a topic of conversation. Rather than judging our kids when they're behaving inappropriately or causing difficulties in the household, spend some time and say, 'How's it going with you at the moment? How are you coping with this? You must be missing school, you must be missing your friends.' Try and give the opportunity to talk about it. It's really important to balance that tendency for people to be despairing and overwhelmed with a sense of hope. This is something we will get through but it's very challenging" (accessed from Sydney Morning Herald online at, August 30 2021).

I encourage all of you to act on this wise advice with the children in your life. Moreover, let's remember that the greatest reason for hope for our children and for us is our faith in a loving God. If it is not already a regular practice I encourage you to start praying with your children and teaching them how to pray regularly, that their hearts will be ready to receive the gifts of hope and peace that God wants to give them (and us) even in these difficult times.

Message from Sr Kerry

Dear Parishioners and Friends of Immaculate Conception Parish Unanderra,

It was a horrible day. Words could never express how heart wrenching the day was.

My mum, who had lost all mobility, was taken into the specialist on a stretcher. Eventually we were called into the specialist room. I stood next to my mum. The doctor covered my mum's left eye and then held up a spanned hand displaying five fingers. My mum was asked what she could see. Nothing had prepared me for my mum's response. Mum said. 'I see nothing!' My mum had lost all sight in one eye. Blind! I felt devastated. The doctor moved away, and my mum said with dignified serenity, 'Kerry, I have to be grateful that I have had sight for 92 years.'

When my mum first moved to the nursing home, I felt so sad for her. This was my mum and she deserved better. Mum was in a two bed room and the other lady could sit by the window and look out onto a garden. As for my mum, all she could see from her bed was the long, hospital like corridor, and the comings and goings of the staff. I envied the woman who had the window.

My envy was soon turned to gratitude, for my mum with her left eye could still see up the corridor. She could see her family walking towards her as they came for their very regular visits. The joy of their steps could be felt in the eye that still had sight. My disease of envy had certainly been cured. Like my mum I had much to be thankful for.

Today's reading speaks so much of healing. Healing comes in so many forms. In relation to ourselves, if we are honest with ourselves, physical healing needed is probably down the list. What needs healing within me today? Whether my dad is living or deceased, am I at peace? Am I at peace with my children? What blinds me from seeing the goodness of others? Is there one person this week that, in some way, I can extend healing?

As we walk this week I pray that each of us has courage.....courage that prevents us from stumbling over the things behind us.

There is now a quicker and easier way, with Service NSW launching personalised check-in cards to replace scanning in with QR codes for those without smartphones.



5 SEPTEMBER 2021 — TWENTY THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (YEAR B)

First Reading — Isaiah 35:4-7 *Then the ears of the deaf shall be opened and the tongues of the dumb shall speak*

Say to all faint hearts,
'Courage! Do not be afraid.
Look, your God is coming,
vengeance is coming,
the retribution of God;
he is coming to save you.'
Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened,
the ears of the deaf unsealed,
then the lame shall leap like a deer
and the tongues of the dumb sing for joy;
for water gushes in the desert,
streams in the wasteland,
the scorched earth becomes a lake,
the parched land springs of water.

Responsorial Psalm — Praise the Lord, my soul!

1. It is the Lord who keeps faith for ever, who is just to those who are oppressed.
It is he who gives bread to the hungry, the Lord, who sets prisoners free. R.
2. It is the Lord who gives sight to the blind, who raises up those who are bowed down.
It is the Lord who loves the just, the Lord, who protects the stranger. R.
3. The Lord upholds the widow and orphan but thwarts the path of the wicked.
The Lord will reign for ever, Zion's God, from age to age. R.

Second Reading — James 2:1-5 *Has not God chosen the poor of the world to inherit the kingdom?*

My brothers, do not try to combine faith in Jesus Christ, our glorified Lord, with the making of distinctions between classes of people. Now suppose a man comes into your synagogue, beautifully dressed and with a gold ring on, and at the same time a poor man comes in, in shabby clothes, and you take notice of the well-dressed man, and say, 'Come this way to the best seats'; then you tell the poor man, 'Stand over there' or 'You can sit on the floor by my foot-rest.' Can't you see that you have used two different standards in your mind, and turned yourselves into judges, and corrupt judges at that?

Listen, my dear brothers: it was those who are poor according to the world that God chose, to be rich in faith and to be the heirs to the kingdom which he promised to those who love him.

Gospel Acclamation

Alleluia Alleluia! Jesus preached the Good News of the kingdom and healed all who were sick. Alleluia!

Gospel — Mark 7:31-37 *He makes the deaf hear and the dumb speak.*

Returning from the district of Tyre, Jesus went by way of Sidon towards the Sea of Galilee, right through the Decapolis region. And they brought him a deaf man who had an impediment in his speech; and they asked him to lay his hand on him. He took him aside in private, away from the crowd, put his fingers into the man's ears and touched his tongue with spittle. Then looking up to heaven he sighed; and he said to him, 'Ephphatha', that is, 'Be opened.' And his ears were opened, and the ligament of his tongue was loosened and he spoke clearly. And Jesus ordered them to tell no one about it, but the more he insisted, the more widely they published it. Their admiration was unbounded. 'He has done all things well,' they said 'he makes the deaf hear and the dumb speak.'
