During this past week, we have held two Parish "Zoom" sessions online. First, on the Feast of St Therese we gathered to watch a wonderful documentary on St Therese, and I thank all of the St Therese parishioners, St Therese school staff members, and Immaculate Conception parishioners who came along to celebrate this wonderful Saint of ours. Then on the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary we held our first "Zoom Rosary", and again a big thank you to all of the parishioners from both parishes who joined. Across both events, I counted altogether about 70 people, which was a wonderful turnout!

Now that we know Zoom works for so many of us, there is an opportunity for us to take this to the next level! It is true that restrictions are easing, but our capacity to gather for parish events other than Masses will remain very limited until December at the earliest. Would you like to connect with parishioners via Zoom during this period? It may be just socially for a "coffee and chat", or for prayer, or discussion, or some combination thereof. We will then get back to you and aim to facilitate interactive Zoom gatherings as soon as we sense enough interest. You may even form bonds with other parishioners that can continue in person into the future.

As for our return to physically attending Mass together: as mentioned last week there are still a number of steps to be discerned. The Diocesan Council of Priests (of which I am a part) will meet on Wednesday 13th October to finalize the Diocesan directives. When those are finalized, the Parish Pastoral Councils will meet across our two parishes (all via Zoom). At this point, I can assure you that we will NOT be opening our churches by next weekend anywhere in Wollongong Diocese (even though the government will allow churches to open for the vaccinated). I should have more information and explanation for you next weekend. I look forward to seeing you all some time soon – and will keep remembering you all at my daily Masses until then!

# Message from Sr Kerry

Dear Parishioners and Friends of Immaculate Conception Parish Unanderra,

It was the 25th June 1995. I was sitting in the family home having a cuppa with my mum and dad. The conversation was very pleasant.

I grew up in a family that didn't have a great deal in monetary pleasures, but I certainly had all that any child would or could want when it came to love, family, faith and security.

As we sipped on our morning cuppa my dad was speaking about the cake he had offered to make and decorate for the Seniors Club that were to celebrate their 25th anniversary. My mum had made a comment about the cost. Dad then said, 'We are the wealthiest people in Oatley.' It was a very poignant comment.

Less than twenty-four hours later my dad had dropped dead. His words will never leave me. We, as a family, were certainly the wealthiest of families.



Wealth is often measured by the numbers written on one's bank statement. Wealth is much more than possessions. True wealth is certainly much more than dollars. In the Gospel today we hear that Jesus said, 'How hard it is for anyone who has wealth to enter the kingdom of Heaven.' It isn't the wealth that causes the difficulty, it is how we choose to use the wealth given to us?

### **Gospel** — Mark 10:17-30 **Go and sell whatever you have and come follow me.**

Jesus was setting out on a journey when a man ran up, knelt before him and put this question to him, 'Good master, what must I do to inherit eternal life?' Jesus said to him, 'Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. You know the commandments: You must not kill; You must not commit adultery; You must not steal; You must not bring false witness; You must not defraud; Honour your father and mother.' And he said to him, 'Master, I have kept all these from my earliest days.' Jesus looked steadily at him and loved him, and he said, 'There is one thing you lack. Go and sell everything you own and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me.' But his face fell at these words and he went away sad, for he was a man of great wealth.

Jesus looked round and said to his disciples, 'How hard it is for those who have riches to enter the kingdom of God!' The disciples were astounded by these words, but Jesus insisted, 'My children,' he said to them 'how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God.' They were more astonished than ever. 'In that case' they said to one another 'who can be saved?' Jesus gazed at them. 'For men' he said 'it is impossible, but not for God: because everything is possible for God.'

Peter took this up. 'What about us?' he asked him. 'We have left everything and followed you.' Jesus said, 'I tell you solemnly, there is no one who has left house, brothers, sisters, father, children or land for my sake and for the sake of the gospel who will not be repaid a hundred times over, houses, brothers, sisters, mothers, children and land – not without persecutions – now in this present time and, in the world to come, eternal life.'
