Messages from Fr Duane

I start by expressing my deep gratitude to all who contributed to the celebration of my 10th anniversary of Ordination last weekend. It was a lovely opportunity to celebrate the gift of the Priesthood and the gift of our Parish, together with our Bishop. Unfortunately it was not possible to have refreshments afterwards due to the Covid restrictions. However, this Sunday the Bishop will celebrate 10am Mass at St Therese West Wollongong, and given the easing of restrictions this week, a morning tea will be held after that Mass in the school hall. If you wish to attend only the morning tea, *feel free to come along from around 11am*, to share some refreshments and spend some time with each other and our Bishop. Thank you for your best wishes and prayers and please continue to pray for me, as I do for you.

Please see the attached updated Diocesan Directives in response to the implementation of "Stage 3" easing of restrictions by the NSW Government. Some points of note from the Directives: there will be no capacity limits; masks will no longer be compulsory in the church, though encouraged especially in cases where social distancing will be difficult (eg Christmas Masses); QR codes (or other check-in measure where QR registration is not possible) remains necessary, such that the monitoring processes will continue unchanged.

At this point in time there will be no capacity limits at our Christmas Masses, and therefore no need to "book" in advance. However if Government restrictions return to a density limit (as happened last year just before Christmas) then we will implement our "Plan B" – a slightly modified Christmas timetable, and a booking system. Please stay tuned to our emailed communications this week.



19 DECEMBER 2021 — FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT (YEAR C)

First Reading — Micah 5:1-4 Out of you will be born the one who is to rule over Israel.

The Lord says this:

But you, Bethlehem Ephrathah,

the least of the clans of Judah,

out of you will be born for me

the one who is to rule over Israel;

his origin goes back to the distant past,

to the days of old.

The Lord is therefore going to abandon them

till the time when she who is to give birth gives birth.

Then the remnant of his brothers will come back

to the sons of Israel.

He will stand and feed his flock

with the power of the Lord,

with the majesty of the name of his God.

They will live secure, for from then on he will extend his power

to the ends of the land.

He himself will be peace.

3. May your hand be on the man you have chosen,

This is what Christ said, on coming into the world:

You who wanted no sacrifice or oblation,

prepared a body for me.

You took no pleasure in holocausts or sacrifices for sin;

then I said,

just as I was commanded in the scroll of the book,

'God, here I am! I am coming to obey your will.'

Notice that he says first: You did not want what the Law lays down as the things to be offered, that is: the sacrifices, the oblations, the holocausts and the sacrifices for sin, and you took no pleasure in them; and then he says: Here I am! I am coming to obey your will. He is abolishing the first sort to replace it with the second. And this will was for us to be made holy by the offering of his body made once and for all by Jesus Christ.

Gospel — Luke 1: 39–45 Why should it happen that I am honoured with a visit from the mother of my Lord?

Mary set out and went as quickly as she could to a town in the hill country of Judah. She went into Zechariah's house and greeted Elizabeth. Now as soon as Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the child leapt in her womb and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit. She gave a loud cry and said, 'Of all women you are the most blessed, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. Why should I be honoured with a visit from the mother of my Lord? For the moment your greeting reached my ears, the child in my womb leapt for joy. Yes, blessed is she who believed that the promise made her by the Lord would be fulfilled.'
