Message from Fr Duane

Lent is a time of prayer, fasting (making sacrifices) and almsgiving (giving generously of our gifts). We have many practical opportunities to take up these Lenten commitments this year.

As we state in our Parish Vision, "we welcome everyone and help each other to discover their unique gifts, joyfully working together as one to bring the overflowing love of Jesus to all people." You may recall our "Pentecost Gathering" last year, at which our Parish Pastoral Council helped people discover their own unique gifts and invited expressions of interest in sharing those gifts in various "ministries" (ways of service). We knew that not everyone could attend those gatherings, but that EVERYONE is indeed blessed with unique gifts to share, so we were always determined to complete that process by giving every parishioner an opportunity to express their interest in the various ministries. With the lockdowns and uncertainty around Covid this proved difficult – but this weekend, every parishioner will have this opportunity at Masses with a simple checklist that the PPC will provide, and for those unable to attend Mass at this time we will share the same materials via email in a "Google Form" in the coming week.

Feel free to express your interest in as many ministries as you wish, and we will get back to you with more information and formation opportunities for new and existing ministers in the coming weeks and months. Let us also take this opportunity to thank all those who already give of themselves so generously in countless ways behind the scenes.

WAR IN UKRAINE AND FLOODS IN AUSTRALIA

Speaking of bringing the "overflowing love of Jesus to all people", there are many opportunities to put this into action beyond our parish community as well. As I mentioned last weekend at Masses, it is difficult to watch and hear the news of the present crises in Ukraine and now the floods in Australia. As Christians we should be moved to compassion - but never moved to despair! Let's remember the power of persistent prayer, always. But let us not stop at prayer - indeed one of the fruits of persistent prayer is that it opens us up to hear how God may be asking us to be part of the answer to the material needs of those who are suffering.

At this stage my own research brings me to *Caritas International and the St Vincent De Paul Society* as two trustworthy Catholic charities making a real difference in the midst of these crises. Caritas International have been providing assistance on the ground in Ukraine since 2014, and they are bravely continuing their work even in the present crisis, "providing Internally-displaced people on the move with essential information, food, drinking water and personal hygiene kits, as well as a safe and secure place to sleep, eat and wash themselves. Caritas staff and volunteers also provide safe transport for displaced families to reach their loved ones." You can read more and donate through this link:


The local consultation period for the international Synod on Synodality has been extended. Submissions can now be received through the online portal until Sunday, 13 March 2022.

6 MARCH 2022—FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT (YEAR C)

First Reading — Deuteronomy 26:4-10 The confession of faith of the elect.

Moses said to the people: 'The priest shall take the pannier from your hand and lay it before the altar of the Lord your God. Then, in the sight of the Lord your God, you must make this pronouncement:

"My father was a wandering Aramaean. He went down into Egypt to find refuge there, few in numbers; but there he became a nation, great, mighty, and strong. The Egyptians ill-treated us, they gave us no peace and inflicted harsh slavery on us. But we called on the Lord, the God of our fathers. The Lord heard our voice and saw our misery, our toil and our oppression; and the Lord brought us out of Egypt with mighty hand and outstretched arm, with great terror, and with signs and wonders. He brought us here and gave us this land, a land where milk and honey flow. Here then I bring the first-fruits of the produce of the soil that you, the Lord, have given me."

If your lips confess that Jesus is Lord and if you believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, then you will be saved. By believing from the heart you are made righteous; by confessing with your lips you are saved. When scripture says: those who believe in him will have no cause for shame, It makes no distinction between Jew and Greek: all belong to the same Lord who is rich enough, however many ask his help, for everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.

Filled with the Holy Spirit, Jesus left the Jordan and was led by the Spirit through the wilderness, being tempted there by the devil for forty days. During that time he ate nothing and at the end he was hungry. Then the devil said to him, 'If you are the Son of God, tell this stone to turn into a loaf.' But Jesus replied, 'Scripture says: Man does not live on bread alone.'

Then leading him to a height, the devil showed him in a moment of time all the kingdoms of the world and said to him, 'I will give you all this power and the glory of these kingdoms, for it has been committed to me and I give it to anyone I choose. Worship me, then, and it shall all be yours.' But Jesus answered him, 'Scripture says:
