Message from Fr Duane

Thank you for your patience and understanding with the modified and reduced Mass timetable across the two parishes of Unanderra and West Wollongong in Fr Jerzy's absence. As much as I wish I could have maintained the timetable in both, it simply would not have been possible given my workload. In coming weeks there will be further changes also which I outline below.

As you might have observed, there is an urgent need for repainting of the interior of the church for both aesthetic and maintenance purposes. I am very grateful to the Parish Finance Council for its wise discernment of the best use of our resources during recent years. With the decision to sell the 7 Grace St property as soon as this option became available, the funds became available to carry out much needed repairs and maintenance in the church, presbytery, and convent. It would have been premature to paint the church while leaks were still occurring from the ceiling. Now that the leaks in the Church roof are repaired, the task of repainting the church can finally be undertaken.

The only way for this project to proceed is for the pews to be moved and scaffolding brought into the church which requires closure of the church for the duration of the painting project – 6-8 weeks beginning on 26th June.

As such, from <u>Monday 26th June, the Immaculate Conception Church will be closed for 6-8 weeks</u>. During that time, no weekday Masses will take place at Unanderra, and the usual weekday Mass timetable will recommence at St Therese. Moreover, during that period of the Unanderra church being closed, the 6pm Saturday Mass and 8am Sunday Mass that usually take place at Unanderra will take place in St Therese Church West Wollongong. If anyone requires help with transport to travel to West Wollongong for those Masses, please inform us at the parish office, and we will organize this for you. The usual Unanderra ministry rosters will be in place for those Masses, and the financial giving at those two Masses will still be directed towards the Unanderra parish. I am once again most grateful for the wisdom and co-operation shown between our Parish Finance Council and Parish Pastoral Council, as well as the St Therese parish leadership teams, during this time.

Note finally one more change to the weekday timetable for *this week only*: Confirmation liturgies with myself and Bishop Brian (not Masses) will take place Tuesday 5pm and 7pm at St Therese, and Thursday 5pm and 7pm at Immaculate Conception. This means I will not be able to celebrate the Tuesday and Thursday evening Masses at Unanderra. Instead, for this week, I will celebrate the usual Tuesday and Thursday morning Masses at St Therese at 7:45am.

To summarize: **This week:** - No weekday Masses at Unanderra. St Therese Masses Tuesday 7:45am, Wednesday 5:30pm, Thursday 7:45am, Friday 9:30am, Saturday 9am. Weekend Masses as normal in both places.

<u>13-25 June:</u> - Modified weekday timetable in both places (Tuesday and Thursday, evening Masses at Unanderra replace morning Masses at West Wollongong). Weekend Masses as normal in both places.

<u>From 26th June until completion of painting</u> - 6pm Saturday and 8am Sunday Masses take place at St Therese West Wollongong; no weekday Masses at Unanderra, Tuesday and Thursday morning Masses return at West Wollongong

<u>Completion of painting at Unanderra (mid August):</u> - 6pm Saturday and 8am Sunday Masses return to Unanderra; normal weekday timetable resume in both places
