#### **SOCIAL JUSTICE SUNDAY**

This is Social Justice Sunday throughout Australia, and the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference have published their annual Social Justice Statement, "Listen, Learn, Love: A New Engagement with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples". This is a unique statement insofar as it contains the voices of many Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people themselves. I encourage you to read the statement in full.

After sharing stories of Aboriginal people the Bishops quote powerful words from the first Catholic Bishop of Australia, Archbishop Bede Polding, who once said in his testimony to Parliament: "I do not know their language sufficiently well...but I am making myself a black, putting myself in that position, and taking away all that I know except that this is my country, that my father lived by pursuing the emu, and the kangaroo, that I am driven away from my hunting grounds, that my children and tribe are subjected to the grossest barbarities...The Aborigine will demand, 'What right have you to come here? We have not asked you to come, and you take away our lands, you drive away our means of subsistence.'"

The same Spirit who inspired Archbishop Polding to speak such prophetic words in 1845 continues to call us to ever deeper relationships of love and respect with our First Nations people, and to engage with love and humility in the present dialogue about the Referendum.

#### **USUAL MASS TIMETABLE TO RESUME NEXT WEEKEND, 2-3 SEPTEMBER**

Thanks to the many volunteers, led by the project team leaders of George Attard, Gloria Simmonite and Mick Winner, Immaculate Conception Church will be re-opened next weekend, with the Saturday 2nd September 6pm Mass. This means from 2nd September onwards we will return to the usual weekend and weekday Mass timetable across the two parishes.

#### **EUCHARISTIC ADORATION**

Pope Francis recently said: "I believe that we have lost the sense of adoration in our day. We must rediscover the sense of adoration in silence...In the Eucharist, we encounter the One who gave everything for us, who sacrificed himself in order to give us life, who loved us to the end...The Eucharist, then, impels us to a strong and committed love of neighbour. For we cannot truly understand or live the meaning of the Eucharist if our hearts are closed to our brothers and sisters, especially those who are poor, suffering, weary or who may have gone astray in life."

Starting the First Friday of October, there will be an opportunity for extended Eucharistic Adoration at the newly renovated Immaculate Conception Church, Unanderra from 7pm until 10pm. This is in response to many people, especially young adults, expressing a desire for Eucharistic Adoration after work hours. Note: this will only commence if enough people commit to a timeslot. ### Gospel - Matthew 16: 13-20 You are Peter, to you I will give the keys of the kingdom of heaven.

When Jesus came to the region of Caesarea Philippi he put this question to his disciples, 'Who do people say the Son of Man is?' And they said, 'Some say he is John the Baptist, some Elijah, and others Jeremiah or one of the prophets.' 'But you,' he said 'who do you say I am?' Then Simon Peter spoke up, 'You are the Christ,' he said, 'the Son of the living God.' Jesus replied, 'Simon son of Jonah, you are a happy man! Because it was not flesh and blood that revealed this to you but my Father in heaven. So I now say to you: You are Peter and on this rock I will build my Church. And the gates of the underworld can never hold out against it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven: whatever you bind on earth shall be considered bound in heaven; whatever you loose on earth shall be considered loosed in heaven.'
