Message from Fr Duane

As we conclude **National Child Protection Week**, the Church in Australia marks Safeguarding Sunday – a day when we renew our commitment to constantly seeking to make our church and broader community as safe as possible for children and vulnerable adults. It has been encouraging for me to see the progress that our Diocese has made in recent years, including a consolidated Diocesan database ensuring appropriate checks for all involved in any form of ministry; a mandatory Professional Development plan for all involved in leadership in the Church (eg Clergy, CatholicCare, Catholic Education Office, Office of the Bishop staff); the recent investment in broadening the Safeguarding Team for the Diocese, from two to four staff members. Nevertheless there is always more to do.

On a parish level, in consultation with the Parish Pastoral Councils of West Wollongong and Unanderra we have recently established a **Safeguarding Team** across the two parishes. This team was selected from among people whom I knew had expertise and interest in this area. If you would like to know more about this team or get involved in this vital ministry for our parish, please let me know. We will be regularly updating the broader community as to our progress.

As you will see in the Child-Safe Standards listed below from the Royal Commission, the task of keeping our children and vulnerable adults safe is a task that we all share. We have made a lot of progress, but as stated in standard 9 let us commit ourselves to “continuous review and improvement” in this area. This should come naturally to us as Catholics, since we know that a central tenet of our spiritual growth is regularly examining our consciences, acknowledging our failings, and committing to do better: may we apply these same principles together as a church to the vital task of safeguarding those who are most vulnerable in our communities.

10 Child Safe Standards:

1. Child Safety is embedded in institutional leadership, governance and culture
2. Children participate in decisions affecting them and are taken seriously
3. Families and communities are informed and involved
4. Equity is upheld and diverse needs are taken into account
5. People working with children are suitable and supported
6. Processes to respond to complaints of abuse are child-focused
7. Staff are equipped with the knowledge, skills and awareness to keep children safe through continual education and training
8. Physical and online environments minimise the opportunity for abuse to occur
9. Implementation of the Child Safe Standards is continuously reviewed and improved
10. Policies and procedures document how the institution is child safe.



First Reading - Ezekiel 33:7-9

If you have not warned the wicked man, then I will hold you responsible for his death

The word of the Lord was addressed to me as follows, 'Son of man, I have appointed you as sentry to the House of Israel. When you hear a word from my mouth, warn them in my name. If I say to a wicked man: Wicked wretch, you are to die, and you do not speak to warn the wicked man to renounce his ways, then he shall die for his sin, but I will hold you responsible for his death. If, however, you do warn a wicked man to renounce his ways and repent, and he does not repent, then he shall die for his sin, but you yourself will have saved your life.'

Responsorial Psalm - If today you hear his voice! Harden not your hearts.

1. Come, ring out our joy to the Lord; hail the rock who saves us.
Let us come before him, giving thanks, with songs let us hail the Lord. R.
2. Come in; let us bow and bend low; let us kneel before the God who made us
for he is our God and we the people who belong to his pasture,
the flock that is led by his hand. R.
3. O that today you would listen to his voice!
'Harden not your hearts as at Meribah, as on that day at Massah in the desert
when your fathers put me to the test; when they tried me, though they saw my work. R.
4. For you have been my help; in the shadow of your wings I rejoice.
My soul clings to you; your right hand holds me fast. R.

Second Reading - Romans 13:8-10

Love is the fulfilment of the Law.

Avoid getting into debt, except the debt of mutual love. If you love your fellow men you have carried out your obligations. All the commandments: You shall not commit adultery, you shall not kill, you shall not steal, you shall not covet, and so on, are summed up in this single command: You must love your neighbour as yourself. Love is the one thing that cannot hurt your neighbour; that is why it is the answer to every one of the commandments.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, alleluia! God was in Christ, to reconcile the world to himself; and the Good News of reconciliation he has entrusted to us. Alleluia!

Gospel - Matthew 18:15-20

If your brother or sister listens to you, you will have won that person back.

Jesus said to his disciples: 'If your brother does something wrong, go and have it out with him alone, between your two selves. If he listens to you, you have won back your brother. If he does not listen, take one or two others along with you: the evidence of two or three witnesses is required to sustain any charge. But if he refuses to listen to these, report it to the community; and if he refuses to listen to the community, treat him like a pagan or a tax collector.

'I tell you solemnly, whatever you bind on earth shall be considered bound in heaven; whatever you loose on earth shall be considered loosed in heaven.

'I tell you solemnly once again, if two of you on earth agree to ask anything at all, it will be granted to you by my Father in heaven. For where two or three meet in my name, I shall be there with them.'
