Message from Fr Duan

Friday, 6th October, is the beginning of our new initiative of extended Eucharistic Adoration, at this point taking place on the First Friday of every month from 7pm to 10pm. "First Fridays" traditionally bring a special focus on the Sacred Heart of Jesus – a devotion which emphasises in a beautiful way the Divine Mercy in the heart of Jesus, made available to us especially in the Sacraments of Reconciliation and the Eucharist. Thank you to those who have organized this initiative (mainly young adults in our community) and for all who committed to attending (parishioners of all ages in our parish and beyond). All are welcome for any part of First Friday Adoration, and Reconciliation is also available during that time.

There is much for us to read and reflect on this week:

- the Pope's letter, *"Laudate Deum"*, published on the feast of St Francis of Assisi (4th October), focusing on the ecological crisis of our time, following on from his Encyclical "Laudato Si" in 2015;

- a statement from the Australian Catholic Bishops called *"Towards the Referendum"* reminding us that "the issues surrounding the Voice are not just political; they are moral and ethical";

- a selection of quotes from St Therese that I compiled for last week's Feast of St Therese;

- a selection of quotes from St John Paul II on the Rosary which I compiled for October as the "month of the Rosary" (marked by the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary on October 7).

We have shared the above via links and attachments in the emailed bulletin this week. If you have not already joined the email list, I encourage you to do so by emailing the parish office and requesting the bulletin via email. Some of these materials should be available in the church - if you have difficulty obtaining any of these documents please simply let me know, or contact the parish office.

ST VINCENT DE PAUL WINTER APPEAL

This weekend we have the opportunity to contribute financially to the vital work of the St Vincent De Paul Society for those most in need in our community. Our local St Vincent De Paul Conference averages over 10 welfare calls per week, often for food, and also other necessities. Families and singles alike facing disadvantage often pay their rent and bills first (which as we know are always increasing) and sometimes have less than \$40 left over for food per week. Thank you to our local "Vinnies" members for your tireless efforts for those most in need, and thank you to all parishioners in advance for your generosity in contributing to this essential work of the church.

SYNOD ON SYNODALITY

This week, the "Synod on Synodality" began in Rome, with Bishops, Priests, and lay men and women from all around the world gathering with Pope Francis in Rome until 29th October. A good starting point to understand the meaning of "synod" is to go back to the origin of the word – in Greek, "sun" meaning "together", and "hodos", meaning "way", or "journey". It is, in essence, an "assembly" – but not simply a human gathering, but a gathering inspired and united by the Spirit of Christ, as the "pilgrim church" discerning the voice of the Spirit through humble listening and dialogue. This Synod will uniquely focus on the very meaning and practice of "synodality" in the universal church of our time. Let us pray for all those attending to be truly open to the leading of the Holy Spirit.

First Reading - Isaiah 5:1-7

The vineyard of the Lord of hosts is the House of Israel

Let me sing to my friend the song of his love for his vineyard. My friend had a vineyard on a fertile hillside. He dug the soil, cleared it of stones and planted choice vines in it. In the middle he built a tower, he dug a press there too. He expected it to yield grapes, but sour grapes were all that it gave. And now, inhabitants of Jerusalem and men of Judah, I ask you to judge between my vineyard and me. What could I have done for my vineyard that I have not done? I expected it to yield grapes. Why did it yield sour grapes instead? Very well, I will tell you what I am going to do to my vineyard: I will take away its hedge for it to be grazed on, and knock down its wall for it to be trampled on. I will lay it waste, unpruned, undug; overgrown by the briar and the thorn. I will command the clouds to rain no rain on it. Yes, the vinevard of the Lord of Hosts is the House of Israel. and the men of Judah that chosen plant. He expected justice, but found bloodshed, integrity, but only a cry of distress.

Gospel - Matthew 21: 33-43

He leased his vineyard to other farmers.

Jesus said to the chief priests and the elders of the people, 'Listen to another parable. There was a man, a landowner, who planted a vineyard; he fenced it round, dug a winepress in it and built a tower; then he leased it to tenants and went abroad. When vintage time drew near he sent his servants to the tenants to collect his produce. But the tenants seized his servants, thrashed one, killed another and stoned a third. Next he sent some more servants, this time a larger number, and they dealt with them in the same way. Finally he sent his son to them. "They will respect my son" he said. But when the tenants saw the son, they said to each other, "This is the heir. Come on, let us kill him and take over his inheritance." So they seized him and threw him out of the vineyard and killed him. Now when the owner of the vineyard comes, what will he do to those tenants?' They answered, 'He will bring those wretches to a wretched end and lease the vineyard to other tenants who will deliver the produce to him when the season arrives.' Jesus said to them, 'Have you never read in the scriptures:

It was the stone rejected by the builders

that became the keystone.

This was the Lord's doing

and it is wonderful to see?

'I tell you, then, that the kingdom of God will be taken from you and given to a people who will produce its fruit.'
