Message from Fr Duane

This Sunday is *World Mission Sunday*. Catholic Mission operates in over 160 countries, including in remote Australian communities, to give practical and spiritual support to those most in need. This year in our annual Mission Appeal we have an opportunity to contribute financially to a specific project of Catholic Mission in Timor Leste. This Sunday also serves as a reminder to every one of us that we are all called to be "missionary disciples". How timely that Pope Francis has published an Apostolic Exhortation on St Therese – the patron saint of missionaries – who taught so powerfully by her words and example that Christ's mission of love is lived primarily in the most ordinary, everyday ways. Single, married, young, old, all can help in this way, with CatholicCare providing all of the training and ongoing support you would need. Please prayerfully consider whether God may be calling you to this – you might be able to provide a place of security, safety and love that could change the whole trajectory of the life of a vulnerable child.

Another local missionary opportunity is volunteering to support the new joint initiative across Unanderra and West Wollongong parishes of providing a *Christmas Lunch* on Christmas Day at St Therese Parish Centre for those who are in need of food or company. Thank you to those who have already contacted the parish office to volunteer. We are now proceeding to the next step of finalizing whether we have enough volunteers to make this happen – please indicate your availability to help in one or more various ways through this Google Form https://tinyurl.com/christmaslunch23.

Finally, let's remember, as St Therese (and all the saints) knew so deeply, that it is prayer that drives our participation in Christ's mission. It was wonderful to see 60 people come to the new initiative at Immaculate Conception Church of extended Eucharistic Adoration on the First Friday of October. All are invited to join once again on the First Friday of November (3rd November) for any part of the evening (7pm to 10pm) with the Sacrament of Reconciliation also available. First Reading - Isaiah 45: 1,4-6

I have taken the hand of Cyprus to subdue nations before his countenance.

Let me see the money you pay the tax with.' They handed him a denarius, and he said, 'Whose head is this? Whose name?' 'Caesar's' they replied.
