Message from Fr Duane

And so we begin the *sacred season of Advent* – which means, "coming". This is the sacred season in which we celebrate the first coming of Jesus and look forward to his second coming – praying that he will come more deeply into our hearts, our homes, our parish and our world during this Advent season. It is fitting that our whole church year begins with Advent – reminding us of the simple truth that person of Christ who came among us, taught us, saved us and remains with us always is the heart of all that we do as Catholics. Our worship at Mass is centred on Jesus. It is Jesus who calls us to share the gifts he has given us to help each other to pray. It is Jesus who calls us and empowers us to care for each other as a community, to build relationships in various ways through our simple community building initiatives. It is Jesus who calls us and empowers us to go out and take special care of the poor, vulnerable, lonely in the many ways that we live this out. It is Jesus who calls us to go and share the good news of his love for all people, through Alpha, RCIA and our other evangelising initiatives. In the words of Bishop Brian in his vision for Parishes published last week, "the beating heart of the parish is the person of Jesus, made present in Word, Sacrament, and the living community of believers." If you haven't yet picked up the 3 documents from the Bishop, please do so, read them when you get an opportunity and hold on to them as we will be building upon them in the coming year with further resources from the Office of the Bishop.

Our Parish Feast Day is <u>THIS FRIDAY 8TH DECEMBER</u> – *the Feast of the Immaculate Conception*. The usual 7am Mass will remain as normal for those who usually attend that Mass, but the main celebration of the Feast Day and of our Parish will take place at a special 6pm Mass, followed by a BBQ on the church grounds. All are welcome – and feel free to invite others! Let us give thanks during Advent for the "yes" of Mary that brought Jesus into our world – that same yes to God that permeated her entire being, as the perfect model of faith, kept free from sin from the very moment of her immaculate conception.

The prayer for the blessing of the Advent wreath is a prayer we can pray throughout the Advent season for ourselves and for our world:

Lord our God, we praise you for your Son, Jesus Christ: he is Emmanuel, the hope of the peoples, he is the wisdom that teaches and guides us, he is the Savior of every nation. Lord God, let your blessing come upon us as we light the candles of this wreath. May the wreath and its light be a sign of Christ's promise to bring us salvation. May he come quickly and not delay. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.
