Message from Fr Duane

Have you ever wondered why we do and say certain things at Mass? Or do you want to get more out of Mass by understanding the ritual actions better? You're not alone – many people, even Catholics who have been coming to Mass for decades, have expressed an interest in learning more about the basics of why we do and say and see the things we do at Mass. Each year, I present a "teaching Mass" as part of the usual preparation of adults becoming Catholic at Easter, but this year in response to broader interest it will be open to all. Note, it will not be an actual Mass, but rather a detailed run-through of what we do, say and see during Mass with explanations and Q and A throughout. This will take place at St Therese Church, West Wollongong (as the PowerPoint screens there will assist the teaching) on Sunday March 3rd at 6:15pm to give people time to depart after the normal (actual) Mass at 5pm. All are welcome – and please feel free to invite anyone who you think might be interested, of any age or stage of faith.

As we enter into this sacred season of Lent, I commend to you the document from Bishop Brian entitled "Lenten penance & obligations", which outlines the details of the commitments Catholics are called to make together during this Lenten season – along with the meaning and purposes behind these commitments. Hard copies are available in the church, and electronic copies are attached with the emailed bulletin this weekend. We have 13 adults currently preparing to become Catholic from across West Wollongong and Unanderra parishes, who will be celebrating the "Rite of Election" this Sunday with Bishop Brian at St Francis Xavier's Cathedral, together with all of the other adults becoming Catholic across the Diocese. Please keep them all in your prayers!

18 FEBRUARY - THE FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT (YEAR B)

First Reading - Genesis 9:8-15

I will recall the covenant between myself and you.... the waters shall never again become a flood to destroy all flesh.

God spoke to Noah and his sons, 'See, I establish my Covenant with you, and with your descendants after you; also with every living creature to be found with you, birds, cattle and every wild beast with you: everything that came out of the ark, everything that lives on the earth. I establish my Covenant with you: no thing of flesh shall be swept away again by the waters of the flood. There shall be no flood to destroy the earth again.'

God said, 'Here is the sign of the Covenant I make between myself and you and every living creature with you for all generations: I set my bow in the clouds and it shall be a sign of the Covenant between me and the earth. When I gather the clouds over the earth and the bow appears in the clouds, I will recall the Covenant between myself and you and every living creature of every kind. And so the waters shall never again become a flood to destroy all things of flesh.'

Second Reading - 1 Peter 3:18-22

The water of the flood is a type of the baptism which saves you now.

Christ himself, innocent though he was, died once for sins, died for the guilty, to lead us to God. In the body he was put to death, in the spirit he was raised to life, and, in the spirit, he went to preach to the spirits in prison. Now it was long ago, when Noah was still building that ark which saved only a small group of eight people 'by water', and when God was still waiting patiently, that these spirits refused to believe. That water is a type of the baptism which saves you now, and which is not the washing off of physical dirt but a pledge made to God from a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has entered heaven and is at God's right hand, now that he has made the angels and Dominations and Powers his subjects.
