
Gospel Reflection

My dear people,

The seasons of the Church year are linked to the Northern Hemisphere (where Christianity began) and its climate patterns. And so our English word LENT simply means springtime, coming from the old English "lengthen", since up north daytime lengthens during this time. The Northern Hemisphere turns towards the sun, the source of life, and winter turns into spring. In Hebrew the word for repentance is "to turn", like the turning of the earth to the sun.



"Even now, says the Lord, turn to me" (Joel 2:12). The word SIN means separation. We are called to turn from our separate selves, from our sin, to come together in community. Self-denial is the way we express our repentance. We turn away from sin and death. In the lengthening brightness (as it were) from Ash Wednesday until Holy Thursday afternoon, our holy Lent, we turn to God as our Source of Life.

Self-denial is 3-fold, advises chapter 6 of St Matthew's Gospel: we pray, we fast, we give alms or gifts to the needy. Self-denial is an exercise, a workout, a getting into shape. Through the Lenten exercise of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving we spring clean our lives, sharpen our senses, put tomorrow in its place, and treasure the day at hand. In prayer, fasting, and works of mercy we pattern ourselves after Our Lord. He prayed, and taught us how to pray. He fasted, and we do likewise. He gave alms. And we are asked to give our very lives to each other.

+++

- The whole of Lent is a penitential season of prayer, self-denial and helping others.
- Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence. The law of fasting binds those who have turned 18 and until their 60th birthday. The law of abstinence binds those who have turned 14.
- Catholics are obliged to receive Holy Communion at least once a year, during the time between Ash Wednesday and Trinity Sunday.

Some Recommendations:

- Daily Mass or at least one extra Mass each week.
- Reading the Scriptures, especially the accounts of the Passion.
- The Sorrowful Mysteries of the Rosary.
- A more careful performance of the duties of our state in life.
- Participation in a Lenten Discussion Group (or use the Diocesan Reflection Book as a personal preparation for the following Sunday's Gospel).
- Project Compassion an excellent means of turning the money saved by fasting into a gift for the poor. The boxes are returned at the Mass of the Last Supper on Holy Thursday evening; the envelopes are returned Sunday by Sunday – whichever system suits you best.
