

My Dear People,

Friday 24 May this week marks the Solemn Feast of Our Lady Help of Christians under which title Australia is dedicated. The title has a long history, but the event which shines out most clearly took place on 7 October 1571. One of the greatest sea battles ever fought took place at Lepanto off the Greek coast in the Ionian Sea. Answering the call of Pope St Pius V, a small Christian fleet led by Don Juan of Austria successfully crushed the overpowering forces of Islam which threatened to engulf all of Catholic Europe. The victory was attributed to Our Lady Help of Christians through the recitation of the Rosary. In thanksgiving, the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary was instituted on 7 October.

The second great victory attributed to the intercession of Our Lady Help of Christians was in 1683 when the Turks attacked Vienna. It was Pope Innocent XI who recommended the Christian cause to Our Lady Help of Christians, and asked all Christendom to recite the Rosary. The battle for Vienna started on Our Lady's Birthday, 8 September, and in three days time on the Feast of Her



Holy Name, 30,000 Christians had crushed the Turkish army of 200,000.

Untaught by the bitter lessons of those who had gone before him, Napoleon in turn was to burn his fingers on Mary's mantle. For five years he held Pope Pius VII prisoner, first at Savona and then at Fontainebleau, while the Church continually made intercession through the Rosary. When the Holy Father re-entered Rome on 24 May 1814, his first official act was to set aside that day in Rome as the Feast of Mary, Help of Christians.

One of the greatest advocates of this title of Our Lady was St John Bosco. Against all odds he built at Turin a magnificent Basilica in her honour in obedience to a vision he had in 1844. (The usual image we know of Our Lady Help of Christians is from that Basilica). It was in that same year that the first Provincial Synod of Bishops in Australia decreed Mary, Help of Christians to be Principal Patroness of this new country. It was a devotion brought here by Australia's pioneer priest, Fr John Therry.

Years ago a priest called Bossence dabbled successfully on the stock exchange and left three-quarters of a million pounds (an enormous amount then) for the building of a National Shrine in Canberra. Archbishop Cahill had plans drawn up. They were rejected as being unworthy of Canberra. The Government Architect redrew the plans — they were published in The Catholic Weekly — an octagonal church, so that you would see the same façade from wherever you were looking across the lake (where the present Archbishop's House is situated). A lantern tower would be seen for miles around.

In time, the cost increased, the Archbishop handed over the responsibility to the Bishops' Conference, who then finally gave the responsibility back to the Archbishop of Canberra. I told

Bishop Murray that I would willingly go around Australia begging for money. He said I had more faith in the sheep than the shepherds did. I still think that this title of Our Lady will have little significance to Australians until there is a visible symbol — a national shrine.

Thursday evening's Mass will be a Vigil Mass for the Feast.
