Message from Fr Duane

GOOD SHEPHERD SUNDAY – 57TH WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR VOCATIONS:

This Sunday — the fourth Sunday of Easter — is "Good Shepherd Sunday" and the 57th World Day of Prayer for Vocations. In my capacity as Vocations Director for our diocese, I have provided a video message for this weekend, beautifully put together by Pete Gilmore, Daniel Hopper, Seth Harsh and Jeremy Yuen from the Office of the Bishop. The video has been shared through our Parish Facebook page and is also available on the diocesan website at https://dow.sh/VocationsMessage2020. Let us take this opportunity to pray for all of us to grow in our vocations, and all young people to come to hear God's call in their lives — to marriage, single life, consecrated life and ordained ministry.

Let's also take this opportunity to pray for our current Seminarians, James Arblaster and our own Sinh Le, as they continue their priestly formation for Wollongong Diocese. We also remember in prayer the 4 young men from Vietnam - James Minh Quy Tran, Martin Hoang Dang-Pham, Peter Thanh Cong Tran and Joseph Huu Minh Vuong Nguyen — who are spending 3 months in Parishes of Wollongong Diocese, receiving intensive English tuition and experiencing Parish life as they and the Diocese discern together whether they will return for 12 months next year, and possibly proceed to subsequent seminary formation for our Diocese. Finally there are also a number of other young men actively discerning their vocation with the Diocese. Let us hold them all in prayer this weekend and continue to pray for more priests to serve the people of our Diocese into the future.

SUNDAY 3 MAY 2020 — FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER (YEAR A)

First Reading — Acts 2:14,36-41 — God has made Jesus both Lord and Christ.

On the day of Pentecost, Peter stood up with the Eleven and addressed the crowd with a loud voice: 'The whole House of Israel can be certain that God has made this Jesus whom you crucified both Lord and Christ.'

Hearing this, they were cut to the heart and said to Peter and the apostles, 'What must we do, brothers?' 'You must repent,' Peter answered 'and every one of you must be baptised in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. The promise that was made is for you and your children, and for all those who are far away, for all those whom the Lord our God will call to himself.' He spoke to them for a long time using many arguments, and he urged them, 'Save yourselves from this perverse generation.' They were convinced by his arguments, and they accepted what he said and were baptised. That very day about three thousand were added to their number.

Second Reading — 1 Peter 2:20-25 — You had gone astray but now you have come back to the shepherd and guardian of your souls.

R.

The merit, in the sight of God, is in bearing punishment patiently when you are punished after doing your duty. This, in fact, is what you were called to do, because Christ suffered for you and left an example for you to follow the way he took. He had not done anything wrong, and there had been no perjury in his mouth. He was insulted and did not retaliate with insults; when he was tortured he made no threats but he put his trust in the righteous judge. He was bearing our faults in his own body on the cross, so that we might die to our faults and live for holiness; through his wounds you have been healed. You had gone astray like sheep but now you have come back to the shepherd and guardian of your souls.

Gospel Acclamation — John 10:14

Alleluia, alleluia! I am the good shepherd, says the Lord; I know my sheep, and mine know me. Alleluia!

Gospel — John 10:1-10 — I am the gate of the sheepfold.

Jesus said: 'I tell you most solemnly, anyone who does not enter the sheepfold through the gate, but gets in some other way is a thief and a brigand. The one who enters through the gate is the shepherd of the flock; the gatekeeper lets him in, the sheep hear his voice, one by one he calls his own sheep and leads them out. When he has brought out his flock, he goes ahead of them, and the sheep follow because they know his voice. They never follow a stranger but run away from him: they do not recognise the voice of strangers.'

Jesus told them this parable but they failed to understand what he meant by telling it to them.

So Jesus spoke to them again:

'I tell you most solemnly, I am the gate of the sheepfold.

All others who have come are thieves and brigands; but the sheep took no notice of them. I am the gate.

Anyone who enters through me will be safe: he will go freely in and out and be sure of finding pasture.

The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I have come so that they may have life and have it to the full.'
