Message from Fr Duane

Amidst the many challenges that Coronavirus has brought, we as Catholics have had the additional challenge of having to forego the opportunity to celebrate the Sacraments together in our churches. As we await the updated directives from our Bishop Brian Mascord next week, he has given permission to clergy to share with our parishioners this weekend that the new directives will make allowance for Masses (maximum of 10 participants) to take place. This will only be possible in parishes which are able to comply with the detailed directives that the Bishop and his advisors will soon publish. Our Parish Pastoral Councils will meet as soon as possible to implement these directives in our parishes of Unanderra and West Wollongong in a way which will ensure compliance with legislation and the safety of all involved. We will provide much more information on this next weekend.



This Monday 25 May, the Church celebrates the Feast of Our Lady Help of Christians. The Feast usually takes place on 24 May but this year the Feast of the Ascension of the Lord takes precedence. It is with this title as "Help of Christians" that Our Lady is the patroness of Australia, making this an especially sacred day for us. It is under this title that Our Lady has been invoked throughout history especially in times of distress — when her help for Christians as our mother and intercessor have been most needed. This is surely one of those times. And so let us entrust ourselves and our nation to her help and prayers; inspired by her example of faith, may we say a deeper "yes" to God's will in both the joys and sorrows of our lives.

SUNDAY 24 MAY 2020 — ASCENSION OF OUR LORD (YEAR A)

First Reading — Acts 1:1-11 — Why are you standing here looking into the sky? Jesus has been taken into heaven.

In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit, and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations: for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them, he had told them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for what the Father had promised. 'It is' he had said, 'what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit.'

Now having met together, they asked him, 'Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth.'

As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, 'Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there.'

Second Reading — Ephesians 1:17-23 — *He made Jesus to sit at his right hand in heaven.*

May the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, give you a spirit of wisdom and perception of what is revealed, to bring you to full knowledge of him. May he enlighten the eyes of your mind so that you can see what hope his call holds for you, what rich glories he has promised the saints will inherit and how infinitely great is the power that he has exercised for us believers. This you can tell from the strength of his power at work in Christ, when he used it to raise him from the dead and to make him sit at his right hand, in heaven, far above every Sovereignty, Authority, Power, or Domination, or any other name that can be named, not only in this age, but also in the age to come. He has put all things under his feet, and made him, as the ruler of everything, the head of the Church; which is his body, the fullness of him who fills the whole creation.

Gospel Acclamation — Matthew 28:19,20

Alleluia, alleluia! Go and teach all people my gospel. I am with you always, until the end of the world. Alleluia!

Gospel — Matthew 28:16-20 — All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me.

The eleven disciples set out for Galilee, to the mountain where Jesus had arranged to meet them. When they saw him they fell down before him, though some hesitated. Jesus came up and spoke to them. He said, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, make disciples of all the nations; baptise them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teach them to observe all the commandments I gave to you. And know that I am with you always; yes, to the end of time.'
