Message from Fr Duane

The Immaculate Conception and St Therese (ICAST) Parish Pastoral Councils met together via Zoom after receiving the latest Diocesan Directives from Bishop Brian Mascord regarding opening of Churches (27 May – refer to "Diocesan Directives" attachment). It was a very fruitful meeting, and I thank our Pastoral Council members for their generosity and wisdom in these complex deliberations, summarised as follows.

Reconciliation is available by appointment with either Fr Duane (0414 626 357) or Fr Jerzy (0410 225 975).

Baptisms are allowed and will be booked through communication with Fr Duane.

Personal prayer in the churches outside of Mass times is not possible at this time, as per the Directives.

Mass attendance is now permitted – with strict regulations in place, and only by prior registration. Refer to the "Mass Attendance Process" attachment for details of how to register for Mass in the Parishes of Immaculate Conception and St Therese.

Please Note: The current Diocesan Directives presume the maximum capacity of 10 worshippers. Though the government increased the limit to 50 (starting Monday 1 June) the detailed health legislation has not yet been released, and the Bishop and his advisors will update their directives as soon as possible. As you will see in the "Mass Attendance Process" attachment, registration for both St Therese and Immaculate Conception will happen through the Unanderra Parish Office, preferably via email. Attendance at Mass will only be possible after receiving confirmation from the Unanderra Parish secretaries; this is to comply with government regulations, and also to create a system that will be safe for all, and fair to all, given the current limitations.

This Sunday we celebrate the Feast of Pentecost, which we speak of as the "birthday of the Church", as the Holy Spirit was poured into the hearts of the Apostles, who began preaching the good news of Christ's Resurrection to all nations. We have received this same Spirit, who unites us as one, and continues to guide the Church through these difficult times.

"Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created. And You shall renew the face of the earth. O, God, who by the light of the Holy Spirit, did instruct the hearts of the faithful, grant that by the same Holy Spirit we may be truly wise and ever enjoy His consolations, Through Christ Our Lord, Amen."

SUNDAY 31 MAY 2020 — PENTECOST SUNDAY (YEAR A)

First Reading — Acts 2:1-11— They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak different languages.

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.

Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome – Jews and proselytes alike – Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'



There is a variety of gifts but always the same Spirit; there are all sorts of service to be done, but always to the same Lord; working in all sorts of different ways in different people, it is the same God who is working in all of them. The particular way in which the Spirit is given to each person is for a good purpose.

Just as a human body, though it is made up of many parts, is a single unit because all these parts, though many, make one body, so it is with Christ. In the one Spirit we were all baptised, Jews as well as Greeks, slaves as well as citizens, and one Spirit was given to us all to drink.
