Message from Fr Duane

The "Season of Creation" began on 1 September, the World Day of Prayer for Creation, and continues until 4 October (the Feast of St Francis of Assisi). This initiative is a united effort by Orthodox and other denominations, which was officially recognised by Pope Francis in 2015 who encouraged Catholics to take this opportunity to reflect on our relationship with God and all creation. We are entrusted by God with the task of caring for and protecting creation, at a time when the self-indulgent materialism of many in our world seek only to exploit it. And yet we cannot take up this responsibility without God; in the Pope's words this year, "we cannot live in harmony with creation if we are not at peace with the Creator who is the source and origin of all things". As we in the Southern Hemisphere begin the season of Spring (with beautiful weather this past week) let's remember that while many activities are paused or limited, the beauty of creation continues to reveal the glory of God. Let's find some time during this "season" to contemplate this beauty, for it is the loving gift of our God to us: "The entire material universe speaks of God's love, his boundless affection for us. Soil, water, mountains: everything is, as it were, a caress of God" (*Pope Francis, Laudato Si, 84*).

Second Reading — Romans 13:8-10 — Love is the fulfilment of the Law.

Avoid getting into debt, except the debt of mutual love. If you love your fellow men you have carried out your obligations. All the commandments: You shall not commit adultery, you shall not kill, you shall not steal, you shall not covet, and so on, are summed up in this single command: You must love your neighbour as yourself. Love is the one thing that cannot hurt your neighbour; that is why it is the answer to every one of the commandments.

Gospel Acclamation

Alleluia, alleluia! God was in Christ, to reconcile the world to himself; and the Good News of reconciliation he has entrusted to us. Alleluia!

Gospel — Matthew 18:15-20 — *If your brother or sister listens to you, you will have won that person back.* Jesus said to his disciples:

'If your brother does something wrong, go and have it out with him alone, between your two selves. If he listens to you, you have won back your brother. If he does not listen, take one or two others along with you: the evidence of two or three witnesses is required to sustain any charge. But if he refuses to listen to these, report it to the community; and if he refuses to listen to the community, treat him like a pagan or a tax collector.

'I tell you solemnly, whatever you bind on earth shall be considered bound in heaven; whatever you loose on earth shall be considered loosed in heaven.

'I tell you solemnly once again, if two of you on earth agree to ask anything at all, it will be granted to you by my Father in heaven. For where two or three meet in my name, I shall be there with them.'
