Messages from Fr Duane

Once again, the 4 square metre rule challenge places significant obstacles for our parish community. I thank the Parish Pastoral Councils of both Immaculate Conception and St Therese parishes (ICAST) who, while still driving the Parish Renewal program for both parishes, were also generous enough to come together at very short notice for a Zoom meeting to discuss the best response to the new restrictions. The details of the ICAST Pastoral Council meeting outcomes are contained in the bulletin notices and were emailed to all on our mailing list on Thursday.

I cannot emphasize enough the need for us to co-operate patiently and charitably with one another during this time, especially with our wonderful monitors who have a very difficult job at this time. As our parishes have done ever since Covid began, let's respond to these challenges by giving more of ourselves to God and each other. And if it does eventuate, in spite of our best efforts, that anyone is not able to enter the church doors due to the legal capacity limit, we are very sorry for the inconvenience and are extremely grateful for your understanding and patience at this time.

ANNUAL LEAVE

I understand that it is a complicated time for me to go on annual leave with the new Covid challenges. However it is not easy to organize supply priests for 2 parishes for successive weeks, and it is now three years since my last real annual leave (since 2 years ago my leave was interrupted by taking on Unanderra parish, and I took no annual leave last year). As such, as many have advised me to do, I am proceeding with my leave as planned. It is much easier to do so knowing that there are so many capable, trustworthy and dedicated leaders in both parishes.

I thank Fr Paul Gurr and Fr Peter Gardiner for celebrating our weekend Masses for this next 4 weekends, Fr Jerzy for celebrating the weekday Masses in both parishes, and Fr George, hospital chaplain, for agreeing to respond to any sick calls in my absence. Note: there is only one change to the weekday timetable at St Therese during this coming 4 weeks: no Eucharistic adoration or Reconciliation on Wednesdays. Fr Jerzy will hear confessions at St Therese from 9:30am to 10:30am as normal, until I return on Saturday 24th July. Unanderra timetable remains unchanged.

PARISH FINANCE COUNCIL - DECISION REGARDING 7 GRACE ST UNANDERRA

Until recently this property had been rented to an elderly parishioner. This parishioner has moved, and the Parish Finance Council (PFC) has discerned the best course of action moving forward. After carefully assessing all possibilities, it was unanimously agreed to sell the property as soon as possible. The main reasons for this decision are as follows:

The annual Parish audit report observed challenges regarding the ongoing sustainability of the parish finances on several occasions, based on the relatively low cash reserves, and has recommended consideration of the sale of the property. This is even more pertinent given financial uncertainty relating to Covid

MMJ (the property managers) have estimated that \$100,000 is required to make the property fit for rental. The Parish finances have other significant demands, especially in relation to significant maintenance costs for the church, as well as of the presbytery and 3 Grace St (Sister Kerry's residence) – repairs which are not currently funded through recurring cash-flow

The PFC recommend selling 'as is' to limit the Parish's exposure to funding repair works that may not be realized in terms of an increase in the sale price

Note - the point relating to loan repayments in last week's notices created some confusion. The present loan repayments do not relate to 7 Grace St, but other work on the church in recent times. Nevertheless sale of this property will save thousands of dollars in interest on these loan repayments in coming years, in addition to the decisive reasons mentioned above. 

Second Reading — 2 Corinthians 8:7,9,13-15

You always have the most of everything – of faith, of eloquence, of understanding, of keenness for any cause, and the biggest share of our affection – so we expect you to put the most into this work of mercy too. Remember how generous the Lord Jesus was: he was rich, but he became poor for your sake, to make you rich out of his poverty. This does not mean that to give relief to others you ought to make things difficult for yourselves: it is a question of balancing what happens to be your surplus now against their present need, and one day they may have something to spare that will supply your own need. That is how we strike a balance: as scripture says: The man who gathered much had none too much, the man who gathered little did not go short.

Gospel — Mark 5:21-43

When Jesus had crossed in the boat to the other side, a large crowd gathered round him and he stayed by the lakeside. Then one of the synagogue officials came up, Jairus by name, and seeing him, fell at his feet and pleaded with him earnestly, saying, 'My little daughter is desperately sick. Do come and lay your hands on her to make her better and save her life.' Jesus went with him and a large crowd followed him; they were pressing all round him.

Now there was a woman who had suffered from a haemorrhage for twelve years; after long and painful treatment under various doctors, she spent all she had without being any the better for it, in fact, she was getting worse. She had heard about Jesus, and she came up behind him through the crowd and touched his cloak. 'If I can touch even his clothes,' she had told herself 'I shall be well again.' And the source of the bleeding dried up instantly, and she felt in herself that she was cured of her complaint. Immediately aware that power had gone out from him, Jesus turned round in the crowd and said, 'Who touched my clothes?' His disciples said to him, 'You see how the crowd is pressing round you and yet you say, "Who touched me?"' But he continued to look all round to see who had done it. Then the woman came forward, frightened and trembling because she knew what had happened to her, and she fell at his feet and told him the whole truth. 'My daughter,' he said 'your faith has restored you to health; go in peace and be free from your complaint.'

While he was still speaking some people arrived from the house of the synagogue official to say, 'Your daughter is dead: why put the Master to any further trouble?' But Jesus had overheard this remark of theirs and he said to the official, 'Do not be afraid; only have faith.' And he allowed no one to go with him except Peter and James and John the brother of James. So they came to the official's house and Jesus noticed all the commotion, with people weeping and wailing unrestrainedly. He went in and said to them, 'Why all this commotion and crying? The child is not dead, but asleep.' But they laughed at him. So he turned them all out and, taking with him the child's father and mother and his own companions, he went into the place where the child lay. And taking the child by the hand he said to her, 'Talitha, kum!' which means, 'Little girl, I tell you to get up.' The little girl got up at once and began to walk about, for she was twelve years old. At this they were overcome with astonishment, and he ordered them strictly not to let anyone know about it, and told them to give her something to eat.
