Message from Fr Duane

There is plenty for you to read this week! Firstly please find attached a Pastoral Letter from Bishop Brian on the Diocesan Response to the Pope's call to a 7 year *Laudato Si'* "action platform". Echoing his predecessors, Pope Francis is reminding the Church of the urgency to care for creation. It is only right after all that we, who know God as our loving Creator and Creator of all things, be leaders in responding to the environmental crises before us. We will be hearing more and planning more as parishes throughout this 7 year journey.

The Office of the Bishop has published the Covid-19 **"Roadmap for the Diocese of Wollongong"**, entitled **"The Church is the People of God"** (attached). Note, while strongly encouraging all parishioners to get vaccinated (in consultation with your GP), the decision has been made that the churches of our Diocese will wait until all are able to worship – meaning "Stage 2" (80% vaccination). The reasons for this decision include the principle that worship of God should exclude no one (while maintaining appropriate safety for all), as well as the practical impossibility of expecting volunteer monitors to police a "vaccinated only" rule. As such we wait an extra two weeks, when the experts have deemed it safe for places of worship to open for all (with the 4 square metre rule and other safety measures in place). The Parish Pastoral Councils of Immaculate Conception and St Therese (ICAST) will meet together (via Zoom) on Tuesday 19th October to finalize details for our two parishes and we will be in touch with everyone in our liturgical ministry rosters after that meeting.

Finally, the Immaculate Conception Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) has been meeting via Zoom during lockdown, and has begun a new initiative of publishing an update on PPC plans after each meeting – the first of which was shared in last week's bulletin. Stay tuned for more details next weekend on our "reopening" plans, and I very much look forward to seeing you all again in our churches soon!

Dear Parishioners and Friends of Immaculate Conception Parish Unanderra,

Fr Greg Boyle SJ really captures my attention because of his amazing ministry. [I suggest you may like to google him.] Fr Greg is an American Jesuit priest who has spent more than thirty years of his priestly life working with gang members who wish to change their lifestyle. Reading his books brings tears to the eyes. Hearing the stories of those he works with is way beyond my comprehension in that I ask how on earth are these people still standing?
