As we return to the 2 square metre rule this weekend, everyone can be assured of a spot at any of our standard weekend Masses – which is a great relief to me, and our wonderful monitors! (This also means we will *discontinue the Sunday 7pm Mass* as it is no longer necessary to ease capacity at the other Masses.) We will continue to maintain our usual safety procedures for the health and peace of mind of all, especially the most vulnerable among us.

This Sunday is the 5th "World Day of the Poor", an observance instituted by Pope Francis. This year, Pope Francis points out the increasing need throughout the world (including in our own backyard) that has arisen as a result of the pandemic. In his own words for this Sunday.

"It is my hope that the celebration of the World Day of the Poor, now in its fifth year, will grow in our local Churches and inspire a movement of evangelization that meets the poor personally wherever they may be. We cannot wait for the poor to knock on our door; we need urgently to reach them in their homes, in hospitals and nursing homes, on the streets and in the dark corners where they sometimes hide, in shelters and reception centres. It is important to understand how they feel, what they are experiencing and what their hearts desire."

First Reading — Daniel 12:1-3 When that time comes your own people will be spared.

When that time comes, your own people will be spared, all those whose names are found written in the Book. Of those who lie sleeping in the dust of the earth many will awake, some to everlasting life, some to shame and everlasting disgrace. The learned will shine as brightly as the vault of heaven, and those who have instructed many in virtue, as bright as stars for all eternity.'
