I know many are uncertain and anxious about returning to Mass at this time. The present practices in our parish Masses are guided by the principle of maximising the safety and peace of mind of all, especially those most vulnerable, so that all can feel comfortable to worship with us in peace. With the present practices of sanitizing, social distancing, masks and no congregational singing, I believe we are safer during our Masses at this time than in most other public settings.

Nevertheless, I understand the decision of many not to attend physically at this time and be assured that the dispensation from the Sunday obligation continues, and you belong as much as ever to our parish community even if not physically attending Mass at this time. As we celebrate the *Feast of the Baptism of the Lord*, the conclusion of the Christmas Season, let us remember the bond we share with one another through our own baptism. This bond is manifested most perfectly when we are all able to worship God together, but it remains still for those unable to join our Masses for whatever reason, as we remain in spiritual communion with God and one another.

Finally, even as we conclude the Christmas season let's remember the Christmas message that Christ is our *"Emmanuel"*, *which means God-with-us.* Whatever our circumstances, let us remain close to him, seeking his will each day, so that we may remain in his peace, in all circumstances.



Second Reading — Titus 2:11-14, 3:4-7 **The saved us through the water of rebirth and renewal in the Holy Spirit.**

God's grace has been revealed, and it has made salvation possible for the whole human race and taught us that what we have to do is to give up everything that does not lead to God, and all our worldly ambitions; we must be self-restrained and live good and religious lives here in this present world, while we are waiting in hope for the blessing which will come with the Appearing of the glory of our great God and saviour Christ Jesus. He sacrificed himself for us in order to set us free from all wickedness and to purify a people so that it could be his very own and would have no ambition except to do good.

But when the kindness and love of God our saviour for mankind were revealed, it was not because he was concerned with any righteous actions we might have done ourselves; it was for no reason except his own compassion that he saved us, by means of the cleansing water of rebirth and by renewing us with the Holy Spirit which he has so generously poured over us through Jesus Christ our saviour. He did this so that we should be justified by his grace, to become heirs looking forward to inheriting eternal life.

Gospel Acclamation

Gospel — Luke 3:15-16, 21-22

When Jesus had been baptised and had been praying, the heavens were opened and the Holy Spirit came upon him.

A feeling of expectancy had grown among the people, who were beginning to think that John might be the Christ, so John declared before them all, 'I baptise you with water, but someone is coming, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to undo the strap of his sandals; he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. Now when all the people had been baptised and while Jesus after his own baptism was at prayer, heaven opened and the Holy Spirit descended on him in bodily shape, like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my Son, the Beloved; my favour rests on you.'
