Message from Fr Duane

One of the priorities of our parish is "building community". But why? This Sunday's Feast, the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, reminds us of the deepest reason why this is so vital to our lives as Catholics: we are created for community, or "communion", because God is not simply a solitary, isolated being. God exists precisely as an eternal Community of Persons – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit – a "Communion" of perfect love. Every human being is created to share in this communion of love with God and each other. Our world, sadly, often does not reflect this communion of love – sin divides us, sometimes tragically, one from another – but as we celebrated throughout the Easter Season, culminating at Pentecost, God never gives up on restoring our communion and deepening it, through the death and resurrection of the Son and the sending of the Spirit. May this Feast Day remind us that "God is love", an eternal Communion of Persons, and so deepen our own commitment as individuals and as a community to continue to deepen our closeness with God, each another, and all people.

Next *Sunday, 19th June*, is the Diocesan Vocations Event, "*Discovering God's Plan for Our Lives*", where all are invited to come to reflect upon how we discern and live God's call in our lives. It will be especially beneficial for young adults seeking guidance in knowing how God is calling them to follow him into fullness of life and love – whether through marriage, single life, religious life or ordained ministry. First Reading- Proverbs 8:22-31 Wisdom was born before the earth was made
