Message from Sr Kerry

My dad died very suddenly near to thirty years ago. I remember that day as if it was this morning. I happened to be at home staying with mum and dad. Dad came out to the kitchen and spoke to mum and me, went into the bedroom and dropped dead.

I grew up in a family that had the basic material necessities of life. I was gifted with wonderful parents and four brothers and a sister. We knew love, security, faith and belonging. Only a few days before my dad died, I heard him say to mum, "We are the wealthiest people in Oatley.' Dad was not speaking of monetary matters.

After dad's death I realised I had been given the pearl of great price. My dad had shown me how to live. In memory of my dad, I bought a pearl....a gentle reminder of dad's legacy and how I am called to live. That is a challenge. We can only strive to live that challenge.

There is a starkness in the readings today but one line: 'Fool! This very night you will have to give up your life,' really strikes me. Sit and ponder. What legacy will be yours to gift to others?

Reflections on the Mass - Listening to God's Word

After having gathered as the body of Christ, we actively listen and respond to God speaking through his word. Through the readings, the psalm and the homily God speaks to us, opening up the mystery of his saving love and his desire for our lives.

There is a beautiful movement in this liturgy. We listen, firstly to a reading from the Old Testament which opens up the hope and promise of Jesus' coming. We then respond in song through the Responsorial Psalm, allowing its words to reinforce the message from the Old Testament. We listen again, this time to the reflections of the early Church through the second reading, usually taken from the letters of St Paul. The liturgy reaches its high point with the Gospel reading, and so we stand and vibrantly sing Alleluia. It is the high point because we listen to Jesus Christ himself, speaking directly to us from his life and teaching on earth. The themes of the first reading and gospel are usually connected to show the continuity of message between the Old and New Testaments and fulfillment of God's promises in Christ. The homily, given by the priest who speaks in the name of Christ, connects these readings with our lived experience in today's world. We again respond by proclaiming our unity in faith and offering our prayers in the Prayer of the Faithful.

We can hopefully sense, in the movement of this liturgy, that our responses are crucial to its meaning and offer of support to one another. By both active listening and responding clearly and audibly, we give hope, courage and support to one another to continue persevering in living the truths and message of our faith. We also give proper worship to Jesus who is truly present and speaking to us.

First Reading— Ecclesiastes 1:2,2:21-23 What do people gain by all their work?

Vanity of vanities, the Preacher says. Vanity of vanities. All is vanity!

For so it is that a man who has laboured wisely, skilfully and successfully must leave what is his own to someone who has not toiled for it at all. This, too, is vanity and great injustice; for what does he gain for all the toil and strain that he has undergone under the sun? What of all his laborious days, his cares of office, his restless nights? This, too, is vanity.

Second Reading — Colossians 3:1-5,9-11 **Seek the things that are above, where Christ is.**

Since you have been brought back to true life with Christ, you must look for the things that are in heaven, where Christ is, sitting at God's right hand. Let your thoughts be on heavenly things, not on the things that are on the earth, because you have died, and now the life you have is hidden with Christ in God. But when Christ is revealed – and he is your life – you too will be revealed in all your glory with him.

That is why you must kill everything in you that belongs only to earthly life: fornication, impurity, guilty passion, evil desires and especially greed, which is the same thing as worshipping a false god; and never tell each other lies. You have stripped off your old behaviour with your old self, and you have put on a new self which will progress towards true knowledge the more it is renewed in the image of its creator; and in that image there is no room for distinction between Greek and Jew, between the circumcised or the uncircumcised, or between barbarian and Scythian, slave and free man. There is only Christ: he is everything and he is in everything.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, Alleluia! Happy the poor in spirit; the kingdom of heaven is theirs! Alleluia!

Gospel — Luke 12:13-21 **To whom will all this wealth of yours go?**

A man in the crowd said to Jesus, 'Master, tell my brother to give me a share of our inheritance.' 'My friend,' he replied, 'who appointed me your judge, or the arbitrator of your claims?' Then he said to them, 'Watch, and be on your guard against avarice of any kind, for a man's life is not made secure by what he owns, even when he has more than he needs.'

Then he told them a parable: 'There was once a rich man who, having had a good harvest from his land, thought to himself, "What am I to do? I have not enough room to store my crops." Then he said, "This is what I will do: I will pull down my barns and build bigger ones, and store all my grain and my goods in them, and I will say to my soul: My soul, you have plenty of good things laid by for many years to come; take things easy, eat, drink, have a good time." But God said to him, "Fool! This very night the demand will be made for your soul; and this hoard of yours, whose will it be then?" So it is when a man stores up treasure for himself in place of making himself rich in the sight of God.'
