Message from Fr Duane

As of next weekend, beginning 29th October, we will have a further easing of Covid Restrictions in the Diocese of Wollongong. These Directives will be emailed to those on our email list (if you aren't on our emailing list please email our parish office to join). If you don't have email you can request a copy from the Parish Office. Briefly, the three changes enacted are that the obligation to attend Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation will be reinstated, with the usual exception for those who are ill or other serious reasons; the filling of Holy Water stoups; and the possibility of receiving Communion on the tongue once again. These changes correspond to the easing of restrictions in other Dioceses as well as in broader society at this time.

I am aware that there is a broad range of attitudes towards Covid at this time, as well as the reality of people who are vulnerable and immunocompromised among us (or living with people who are vulnerable). Note that there is no obligation to use Holy Water for those who are not comfortable returning to that practice at this point in time. When it comes to Communion, as discerned by the Council of Priests in our Diocese and other places, I ask that all who wish to receive Communion on the tongue come **only to the priest**, and all other ministers of Holy Communion will continue to only give Communion in the hand.

This Sunday is World Mission Sunday, and I commend to you the message from Sister Kerry below, as well as these words of Pope Francis for this day:

"Dear brothers and sisters, I continue to dream of a completely missionary Church, and a new era of missionary activity among Christian communities. I repeat Moses' great desire for the people of God on their journey: "Would that all the Lord's people were prophets!" (Num 11:29). Indeed, would that all of us in the Church were what we already are by virtue of baptism: prophets, witnesses, missionaries of the Lord, by the power of the Holy Spirit, to the ends of the earth! Mary, Queen of the Missions, pray for us!"


STIC Young Adults prayer mini series
