Message from Fr Duane

I want to firstly thank everyone who contributed to our Christmas Masses last weekend. It was another example of so many good and generous parishioners joyfully working together to help everyone who came to experience more of the joy and peace of Christ. It was great to see such large crowds at Christmas Masses again. At the same time, we must also remain mindful of those who might have no connection with Christianity, who might not even have considered coming to Mass at Christmas – a growing group in our time – but Christ came for them too! As we heard in the Gospel, Christ’s coming was “good news of great joy – a joy to be shared by the *whole people*”. Which brings me to “Alpha”.

Alpha is a joint initiative of Unanderra and West Wollongong parishes, supported by the Diocesan Office of Renewal and Evangelisation. It is open to all, at whatever stage of faith, but is also the most accessible connection point I have seen for those who have had no faith connection in their lives. At our Christmas Masses we launched Alpha for 2023, which **begins Wednesday February 8 at the brand new St Therese Parish Centre**. During these coming weeks, let us all prayerfully consider who we might invite to come along to Alpha. Remember to let them know that there is no cost, no commitment, and they can just “come and see” the first week (or second week – or, at the latest, the third week). Feel free to take our invitation cards (with the words “Stay Curious”) to give to as many people as you wish. Finally – for Alpha to work we will also need generous volunteers amongst our parishioners to help with catering. If you have gifts in this area and are willing to help even for just one Alpha night, please contact the parish office – many hands will make light work! Let’s all keep Alpha in our prayers.



1 JAN - MARY, THE HOLY MOTHER OF GOD (YEAR A)

First Reading - Numbers 6:22-27 *They will call down my name on the children of Israel and I will bless them.*

The Lord spoke to Moses and said, 'Say this to Aaron and his sons: "This is how you are to bless the sons of Israel. You shall say to them:

May the Lord bless you and keep you.

May the Lord let his face shine on you and be gracious to you.

May the Lord uncover his face to you and bring you peace."

This is how they are to call down my name on the sons of Israel, and I will bless them.'

Responsorial Psalm - May God bless us in his mercy.

Second Reading — Galatians 4:4-7 *When the appointed time came, God sent his son, born of a woman.*

When the appointed time came, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born a subject of the Law, to redeem the subjects of the Law and to enable us to be adopted as sons. The proof that you are sons is that God has sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts: the Spirit that cries, 'Abba, Father', and it is this that makes you a son, you are not a slave any more; and if God has made you son, then he has made you heir.
