Message from Fr Duane

This Sunday marks the culmination of the Easter Season with the beautiful Feast of Pentecost. This celebration of the coming of the Holy Spirit marks the "birth of the Church", when the followers of Christ were first filled with his Spirit and empowered to continue his mission to the ends of the earth. This weekend also marks the conclusion of Laudato Si Week, and the beginning of National Reconciliation Week. Let's pray that by the power of the Holy Spirit we will move to a deeper reconciliation and unity with our First Nations people and a deeper commitment to working together to care for the earth and for the poor, as Pope Francis has called us to do through Laudato Si. Let us pray for a renewal of our parish, and of the Church in Australia and throughout the world, this Pentecost.

This week Fr Jerzy (Polish Chaplain who celebrates weekday Masses at Unanderra) travels to Poland to visit his family. We wish him all the very best for a restful and refreshing time reconnecting with his family and assure him of our prayers for safe travels and a safe return. In Fr Jerzy's absence, I have discerned that it would not be prudent for me to celebrate two Masses each day, given my current workload in the parishes and as Diocesan Vocations Director. Instead I will be celebrating the Masses that are generally most well attended in each place – namely, Tuesday and Thursday evenings at Unanderra, and Wednesday evening, Friday morning and Saturday morning at West Wollongong. *Note: this modified weekday timetable will begin this week (29th May) and conclude on Saturday 24th June.* I also list below alternative weekday Masses in our local area. A different timetable will begin from Monday 26th June, as during that time Immaculate Conception Church Unanderra will be closed for painting. I will explain all of that in greater detail in next week's bulletin.

How often do our thoughtless actions hurt another? This week let's make a point of once a day noting the goodness, beauty and uniqueness of at least one person. What richness we will discover. Then think about your own goodness. Allow yourself to be surprised.

They were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak different languages

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.

Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome - Jews and proselytes alike - Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

Second Reading - Corinthians 12:3-7,12-13 In the one Spirit we were all baptised, making one body

No one can say, 'Jesus is Lord' unless he is under the influence of the Holy Spirit.

There is a variety of gifts but always the same Spirit; there are all sorts of service to be done, but always to the same Lord; working in all sorts of different ways in different people, it is the same God who is working in all of them. The particular way in which the Spirit is given to each person is for a good purpose.

Just as a human body, though it is made up of many parts, is a single unit because all these parts, though many, make one body, so it is with Christ. In the one Spirit we were all baptised, Jews as well as Greeks, slaves as well as citizens, and one Spirit was given to us all to drink.
