Message from Fr Duane

Together with the whole Diocese, we continue to mourn the loss of Bishop Peter Ingham and pray for the repose of his soul. Attached with the emailed bulletin is a copy of a prayer card (hard copies of which are available in the church) and a media release about Bishop Peter's passing which contains a brief summary of his life and ministry (with one hard copy available in the church for people to read). Many of us knew Bishop Peter as a joyful, compassionate shepherd, full of faith, love and encouragement for the people of God. Details of the Vigil and Funeral Mass are in the main section of this bulletin. Note also that given the capacity limitations on site at the Cathedral, all are welcome to come to St Therese Parish West Wollongong on Friday 10th May at 10:30am to participate in the Mass via the live stream which will be shown on the screen, and Holy Communion will be distributed by acolytes / Communion ministers. This is also taking place at hubs around the Diocese, and the live stream link is also available in the main section of the bulletin for viewing at home. Eternal rest grant to him O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon him. May his soul and the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.

VIGIL MASS TIME – If interested, please fill out one more survey

When Daylight Saving ended a number of parishioners expressed a desire to change the Vigil Mass time to 5pm. In an effort to ensure a clear and lasting decision moving forward, 3 options were provided in a survey, results of which were to be collected until the conclusion of this weekend. The 3 options provided were 6pm Mass all year, 5pm Mass all year, or 5pm Mass without Daylight Saving and 6pm with Daylight Saving. I had hoped that one option might come out with a clear majority preference, however, results so far have been quite evenly spread across the three options (with wise reasons also provided for all three). This has led me to a slight change of plan for this weekend. Rather than asking only those who have not yet completed a survey to complete one, I am now asking ALL who are interested in this question to complete the survey this weekend, but now via the "preferential voting" system (1 as first preference, 2 as second preference and 3 as third preference) rather than simply ticking your first preference. I know this might seem like a bit of a pain (for myself also!) but this short-term pain will lead to longer term clarity in deciding what is best for our community. We will collate results until Thursday 9th May, and, as planned, I will communicate a final decision next weekend (11-12 May) which will take effect from Sunday 18th May. Thank you for your co-operation and patience with this process.

A SOLEMN PONTIFICAL MASS OF CHRISTIAN BURIAL for Bishop Peter will be offered at St Francis Xavier Cathedral, Wollongong, on Friday 10 May 2024, commencing at 10:30am. Interment will take place in the cathedral grounds at the conclusion of Mass.

Relatives, friends, and the people of God are invited to attend the vigil and funeral. Please note, there will be street parking only for the public.

Due to the large number of invited bishops, clergy, relatives, dignitaries, and close friends attending the funeral, there will be very limited seating inside the cathedral. Therefore, a large marquee containing overflow seating with television screens will be erected in the carpark adjacent to the cathedral. 5 MAY - SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER (YEAR B)

First Reading - Acts 10:25-26, 34-35, 44-48 The gift of the Holy Spirit was poured out upon the gentiles also

As Peter reached the house Cornelius went out to meet him, knelt at his feet and prostrated himself. But Peter helped him up. 'Stand up,' he said 'I am only a man after all!'

Then Peter addressed them: 'The truth I have now come to realise' he said 'is that God does not have favourites, but that anybody of any nationality who fears God and does what is right is acceptable to him.'

While Peter was still speaking the Holy Spirit came down on all the listeners. Jewish believers who had accompanied Peter were all astonished that the gift of the Holy Spirit should be poured out on the pagans too, since they could hear them speaking strange languages and proclaiming the greatness of God. Peter himself then said, 'Could anyone refuse the water of baptism to these people, now they have received the Holy Spirit just as much as we have?' He then gave orders for them to be baptised in the name of Jesus Christ. Afterwards they begged him to stay on for some days.
