#### SATURDAY VIGIL MASS TIME CHANGE – 5PM WITHOUT DAYLIGHT SAVING

Thank you to all parishioners for your co-operation and patience with the surveys about the Saturday Vigil Mass during this past two weeks. With only two Sunday Masses possible in the parish (given my responsibilities across two parishes) I felt it extra important to discern the most suitable Saturday evening Mass time for all. The second (preferential) survey did indeed confirm what I had thought probable after calculating the first simple survey – that the timetable that best suits the whole community is 5pm without Daylight Saving, and 6pm with Daylight Saving. I appreciated all of the feedback given, and while there were good reasons for all possibilities, taking all information into account it is now decided: *Commencing Saturday 18th May, Saturday Vigil Mass will be at 5pm;* and once Daylight Saving recommences, Saturday Vigil Mass will be at 6pm (which will commence on Saturday October 12th). Feel free to ask me for more details of the counts and calculations if you wish to know the details.

#### SATURDAY RECONCILIATION TIME CHANGE - 11am-12noon all year round

Even before the suggestion of a Mass time change, I had been discerning this change to the Reconciliation time for Saturdays, as I often found myself too rushed to prepare myself properly for Mass when Reconciliation took place just before Mass. As such, commencing Saturday 18th May, the time for the Sacrament of Reconciliation at Unanderra will be 11am-12pm throughout the whole year (replacing 5pm Saturday evening).

#### **MOTHERS DAY**



## 12 MAY - THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD (YEAR B)

#### First Reading - Acts 1:1-11 Why are you standing there looking into the sky? Jesus has been taken into heaven.

In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit, and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations: for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them, he had told them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for what the Father had promised. 'It is' he had said 'what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit.'

Now having met together, they asked him, 'Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth.'

As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, 'Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there.'

#### Second Reading - Esphesians 1:17-23 He made Jesus to sit at his right hand in heaven

May the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, give you a spirit of wisdom and perception of what is revealed, to bring you to full knowledge of him. May he enlighten the eyes of your mind so that you can see what hope his call holds for you, what rich glories he has promised the saints will inherit and how infinitely great is the power that he has exercised for us believers. This you can tell from the strength of his power at work in Christ, when he used it to raise him from the dead and to make him sit at his right hand, in heaven, far above every Sovereignty, Authority, Power, or Domination, or any other name that can be named, not only in this age, but also in the age to come. He has put all things under his feet, and made him as the ruler of everything, the head of the Church; which is his body, the fullness of him who fills the whole creation.

#### **Gospel Acclamation:**

Alleluia, alleluia! Go and teach all people my gospel. I am with you always, until the end of the world. Alleluia!

#### Gospel - Mark 16:15-20 The Lord Jesus was taken into heaven and is seated at the right hand of God.

Jesus showed himself to the Eleven and said to them:

'Go out to the whole world; proclaim the Good News to all creation. He who believes and is baptised will be saved; he who does not believe will be condemned. These are the signs that will be associated with believers: in my name they will cast out devils; they will have the gift of tongues; they will pick up snakes in their hands, and be unharmed should they drink deadly poison; they will lay their hands on the sick, who will recover.'

And so the Lord Jesus, after he had spoken to them, was taken up into heaven: there at the right hand of God he took his place, while they, going out, preached everywhere, the Lord working with them and confirming the word by the signs that accompanied it.
