# Message from Fr Duane

My leave begins this week – and I officially return to work on 14th August. I hope that this will be a refreshing time, enabling me to return with more energy and clarity of mind to serve you better as your priest. Contact details during my leave are in the main section of the bulletin. In the absence of Thursday and Friday Masses at West Wollongong, note Unanderra's times of 5:30pm Thursday or 7am Friday; the Cathedral Mass times of 7am Thursday, or 7am and 12:10pm Friday; and many other local Mass times you can find through the Diocesan website or office. Sunday Mass times will remain the same, with gratitude to the priests (and Bishop) who will celebrate these Masses. *Next weekend:* Bishop Brian will celebrate the 6pm Vigil and 8am Sunday Mass at Unanderra; and at West Wollongong, Fr Bill Goldman will celebrate 10am Mass and Fr Leo Duck 5pm Mass.

This Sunday we celebrate "National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Sunday" in the Church throughout Australia, as we mark the beginning of NAIDOC Week. We recently marked "Reconciliation Week" which focuses on continued healing of past wounds and reconciliation and unity for the future of our nation. NAIDOC Week takes on a more celebratory tone as we acknowledge the God-given gifts of our First Nations people. The Church at our best always celebrates the unique and beautiful ways God is working in every culture. I have heard from many First Nations people who have embraced the Catholic faith and recognize deep connections between their culture and their faith. The National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Catholic Council (NATSICC) is entrusted by the Australian Bishops to continue nurturing these connections and have named the theme for this year's celebration "Keep the Fire Burning – Strong in Faith". It is timely for us to remember the powerful words of Pope St John Paul 2 to First Nations people in Alice Springs (and I encourage you to read his whole address, especially this week) – "the Church herself in Australia will not be fully the Church that Jesus wants her to be until you have made your contribution to her life and until that contribution has been joyfully received by others" (John Paul 2, 1986).

## Parish Safeguarding Team

During this past year, a child safeguarding team has been created across the parishes of Unanderra and West Wollongong, composed mainly of ministry leaders in child-facing roles (altar serving and children's liturgy). This team has met a number of times in consultation with the Diocesan Office of Professional Standards and Safeguarding to develop policies and procedures, which are being finalized and will be enacted upon my return from leave. At this point we are looking for volunteers to assist in simply being present at Masses (according to a roster, based on your own availability), for simple safeguarding tasks which you will be fully informed of. Those who already have experience working with children and a Working With Children Check would be especially suitable, but anyone interested can also make contact to find out more information. The first step is to contact the parish office and let us know that you are open to helping in this vital work for our parishes, and once we know how many potential volunteers we have, we will be in touch with you soon about next steps.

In view of the extraordinary nature of these revelations, to stop me from getting too proud I was given a thorn in the flesh, an angel of Satan to beat me and stop me from getting too proud! About this thing, I have pleaded with the Lord three times for it to leave me, but he has said, 'My grace is enough for you: my power is at its best in weakness.' So I shall be very happy to make my weaknesses my special boast so that the power of Christ may stay over me, and that is why I am quite content with my weaknesses, and with insults, hardships, persecutions, and the agonies I go through for Christ's sake. For it is when I am weak that I am strong.

## Gospel - Mark 6:1-6

## A prophet is despised only in his own country.

Jesus went to his home town and his disciples accompanied him. With the coming of the sabbath he began teaching in the synagogue and most of them were astonished when they heard him. They said, 'Where did the man get all this? What is this wisdom that has been granted him, and these miracles that are worked through him? This is the carpenter, surely, the son of Mary, the brother of James and Joset and Jude and Simon? His sisters, too, are they not here with us?' And they would not accept him. And Jesus said to them, 'A prophet is only despised in his own country, among his own relations and in his own house'; and he could work no miracle there, though he cured a few sick people by laying his hands on them. He was amazed at their lack of faith.
